CALL IT WORK WITH LEACOCK?

LONDON, Aug 23 (CP)—"It must have been delightful" to study economics under Prof. Stephen Leacock in the view of W. D. McCullough, Sunday Times reviewer, "and it is astonishing to think that thousands of young men and women in Canada have not been able to listen to his lectures and see his work."

McCullough, reviewing with some show of nostalgia Dr. Leacock's "Here Are My Lectures," recalls an occasion on which the Montreal lecturer, at the Edinburgh University. The hall was crowded and the audience cheered continuously for several minutes when the lecturer said: "Leacock raised his head and said: 'That's nice of you, but it's nothing to the cheers I got when I left my own students at McGill.'" McCullough noted that some half-truths like an old half-brick, is just as deadly as a new one. "Mr. Leacock won't you please come over to Europe at once and give some of your lectures? There's a big opening for a little humor."
