Stocks Push Forward Along Broad Front

NEW YORK, Feb. 16 (AP)—Faced by steels and aircrafts, leading stocks swung forward over a fairly broad front in today's market. Gains ran to 2 or more points at the best, but late profit-taking cut down top marks in the majority of cases. Transfers totalled 852,060 shares against 498,180 the day before. Associated Press average of 60 issues was up .4 of a point at 50.7. Canadian issues moved fractionally in a general forward trend. Distillers, Dome, International Nickel, McIntyre, Walkers, Ford and Imperial Tobacco improved while Lake Shore mines and Quebec Power receded. Brightening the steel outlook were reports of increasing orders from building construction, railroad, armament and miscellaneous fields. Prominent stocks on the forward tilt included U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, Youngstown, Douglas Aircraft, Boeing, United Aircraft, Glenn Martin, North American, Public Service of N. J., General Motors, Chrysler, Westinghouse, Du Pont, Santa Fe, Pennsylvania, Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, U. S. Rubber and Johns-Manville.

Western fresh and regraded butter delivered in Montreal, was offered at 22 1/2-2. Que. No. 1 pasteurized regraded butter in wholesale jobbing lots was 22-2 1/2-5-8. Ontario white and colored cheese sold for 12 cents a pound. Graded egg shipments in used free cases sold at 26 cents a dozen for A-large, 23 for A-medium and 21 for A-pulleys. Potatoes: N. B.
