## DUKE WELCOMED IN BRANTFORD

BRANTFORD, May 11.—Citizens joined in a welcome to the Duke of Connaught here Saturday afternoon.

ONE HUNDRED PEOPLE KILLED BY AN EARTHQUAKE.

NAPLES, May 9.—There are stories of violent earthquake shocks in eastern Sicily which have killed many people and destroyed or wrecked several villages. Mt. Etna volcano is becoming active and there are fears of an overwhelming eruption. Property loss is up in the millions.

Messina reports 40 killed and 40 injured and at Lincera 30 killed and 120 injured at Acreale.

People are fleeing from the vicinity of Etna.

The state railway at Acreale was wrecked and cars thrown 700 feet by the terrific force of the quake.

Trains were derailed and heavy cars lifted as if by a gigantic hand.

An Acreale despatch says that at least 100 people in all were killed by the earthquake.

The town of Lincera, with a population of 2,900, and Veneria, with 2,180, were completely destroyed. Hundreds of houses were wrecked in several villages.

GOT A BIG VERDICT AGAINST N. Y. BROKERAGE FIRM

BINGHAMPTON, N. Y., May 9.—A jury in the Supreme Court handed down yesterday a verdict for \$53,208 against C. I. Hudson and Company, New York brokers, establishing a new precedent, holding brokerage firms responsible for monies expended with them which had been obtained by illegal methods.

The action was brought by Devo and Hitchcock against Hudson and Company to recover \$50,000 spent in speculation by William Sarver, a member of the firm, before he mysteriously disappeared. The jury returned a verdict for the full amount asked.

DEADLOCK CONTINUES OVER ULSTER MATTERS.

LONDON, May 8.—Rumors of a further meeting of the party leaders were current yesterday, but were unconfirmed. Several of the Unionists who objected to any weakening in the opposition to Home Rule interviewed Bonar Law. Many members on both sides are beginning to express scepticism regarding the possibility of an agreement between the absolutely divergent attitudes of the Unionists and the separatists.

Small groups of members on both sides are working away at the federal idea, but they are practically disregarded by the leaders of both parties.

POLAR BEAR EATS A BOY

QUEBEC, May 9.—H. White, who was the first to seek a permit to establish a fur farm in Ungava, reports that in September 1913, at Napoktik Bay, in Northern Labrador a young Eskimo boy was devoured by a Polar bear. The boy was asleep with his brother in a boat anchored a little way off the shore. One of them awoke and saw the bear which had raised his head and forepaws into the boat. He kept absolutely quiet and the animal let go of the boat, but immediately afterwards climbed on again, seized the boy who was asleep and carried him ashore. The bear was shot by native hunters but the boy had been carried off and was already completely devoured.
