Easter's W. L. pen was second with 59 eggs, 68.1 points. Mr. William Sansom's B. R., hens numbers 5 and 8 are first and second in the contest for individual production with 208 eggs, 239.6 points and 195 eggs, 222.4 points; the Experimental Farm, Charlottetown, B. R., hen No. 4 pen No. 7

is third with 192 eggs, 219 points. The pens leading in production are:
