PARIS, August 12.—What are described as remarkable cures of wounded French soldiers have been effected by the new polyvalent serum, discovery of which was announced last March. Complete recovery is announced of men who were terribly mangled, and for whom all hope had been given up before use of the serum, so badly infected were their wounds.

Dr. Inchausti and Vallee, the discoverers of the serum, have been unable up to the present to make more than 2,000 flasks of it daily, most of which goes to the base hospitals, where the worst cases are to be found.

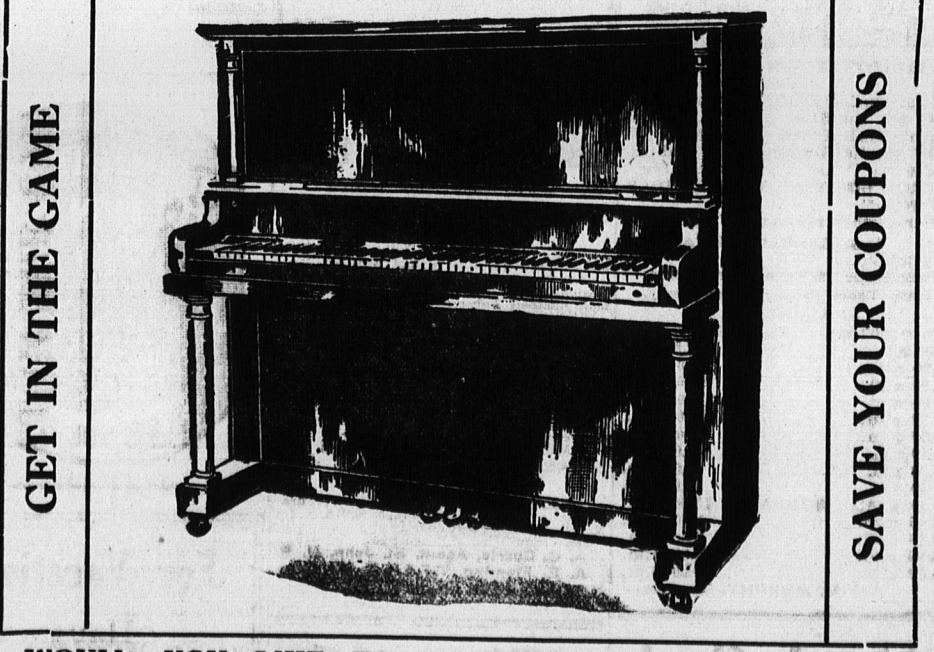
