WEB CLOSES IN ON 'TIMES' DYNAMITERS.

SAN FRANCISCO, Oct. 5.—The net thrown out by the authorities appears to be closing in rapidly on the dynamiters of the Los Angeles Times. "It is certain that the dynamite, which we know was secured at Giant, was taken to Los Angeles and that it was the same dynamite used in the destruction of the Times building and in the bombs found at the Zeehandelaar and Otis residences." This statement was made by Attorney Earl Rogers, of Los Angeles, who is in charge of the man hunt. "We have ordered arrests," said Mr. Rogers, "and we have men now in jail in five different points, between here and Los Angeles and east of San Francisco." He refused to divulge the names of the prisoners or the places where they are held.

The local strike of the metal trades and brewery workers will continue and the State Federation of Labor had guaranteed moral and financial assistance to the strikers according to a resolution adopted by the state convention.

Since the Times disaster, the possibility of declaring the two strikes off has been agitated and one of the local newspapers, which has been friendly to the union cause, has advocated such action. The launch yesterday as the mysterious "Peerless," in which the dynamite was destroyed was brought to Los Angeles. The Pastime showed signs of having her own, and her owner says she was out on hire at the time the dynamite was purchased.
