advanced by their protracted deliberations. The Commission came to a dead lock on the Alaska Boundary matter, which was consequently settled by another body in a manner most unsatisfactory to Canada. "Barkis is within" writes Mr. Thompson. The phrase is not flattering to Canadian vanity, whether it be applied to Sir Wilfrid's willingness to receive the High Commission or to negotiate a reciprocity treaty as a separate proposition. What more is needed to assure our neighbors that they can have reciprocity almost on their own terms? And coming to treat with so much cocksureness, what could be more certain than either that the negotiations must end in a Canadian surrender or, more probably, an entire failure to reach an agreement? Sir Wilfrid's mistake was in permitting himself to be interviewed for publication and in talking too freely through a foreign newspaper on matters in regard to which the Canadian people feel that they have some right to be consulted before terms are offered for discussion and acceptance on the other side of the line.
