THE MARVELLOUS GROWTH OF CANADA'S TRADE

eturns for the Past Six Months Show an Increase of \$18,
110,592 Over the Same Period Last Year.

OTTAWA, Jan. 15.—The trade returns of the Dominion for the six months ending
December 31st last were issued to-day. They show a marvellous growth in the trade
of the country. The aggregate trade of the Dominion for the six months was
\$231,342,207, compared with \$23,331,609 for the same time last year, or an increase of
\$18,110,592.

The trade of the past six months is about eleven million greater than for the
whole of the year 1896. This increase is pretty well divided between imports and
exports. The details for the six months in 1901 and 1902 are:

The exports show a decrease in the output of the mine about three million
dollars, and a decrease of about one million in the fisheries.

On the other hand, the forest wealth shows an increase of over three millions,
animals and their produce over seven millions, agriculture over five millions and
manufactures nearly one million dollars. There is an increase in the duty collected
of \$2,135,473.

For the month of December there was an increase in the imports over Decem-
ber, 1901, of about one million and a half, and in the exports of about five million dollars
while the duty increased by \$422,000.
