**ACADIA** College closes on June 5th.

THE S. S. Electra arrived in port yesterday evening.

THE S. S. City of Ghent arrived in port shortly before eleven o'clock last night.

MEMBERS of Y. M. C. A. Athletic Club are asked to meet for practice this evening at 6.45 at the Park.

THE Government steamer Minto arrived from Pictou early this morning and is taking supplies for Sable Island.—Halifax Echo.

Mr. George Essory shipped a handsome dappled grey horse, by the Princess yesterday morning to J. D. Church, New Glasgow, N. S.

Mr. R. W. Hogg, engaged with the Gam Studio for some time, proposes to take over the Charlottetown business of the above firm.

PREVIOUS to the meeting of the Board of Health last night Messrs Douse and McGregor were sworn in members of the Board.

MR. W. W. CLARK has been officially informed that the Olivette will run on the Charlottetown route during the coming summer.

At the adjourned meeting of the City Council at 10 o'clock yesterday morning the assessment bye-laws were read a third time and passed.

THE steamer Dean which arrived in port to load for Messrs. Carvell Bros. will be taken to the Railway wharf as soon as the steamer Rjukan sails.

THE Steamer Dean arrived in port at 3.30 yesterday afternoon and was jockeyed in an excellent manner by Capt. Mutch who piloted her from Wood Islands. The steamer is from Cardiff.

A MEETING of the Council of the Provincial Rifle Association was held last night in the Prothonotary's office to take into consideration some matters in connection with the season's work.

At one o'clock this morning a special train arrived loaded with oats for the steamer Rjukan which is being loaded by Matheson, Rattenbury and Toombs. It is expected that the loading of the steamer will be completed to-day.

BRUCE STEWART & Co., have the contract for the iron work of 13 cars to be used in the Nova Scotia quarry by the Hillsborough Bridge contractor. Each car has a capacity of 10 tons. The above firm are also supplying castings, steel plates and forgings for part of the air compressors, pile drivers, &c.

WHILE braking on a special train on Tuesday evening Edward Martin had a thrilling experience and one which he will not likely forget for many years to come. It appears that the train which contained some 12 or 13 cars of oats was passing the College near the city and Mr. Martin proceeded to put on the brake, when the spindle broke off and the sudden lurch precipitated him between the cars. Being of an active disposition he lost no time in making up his mind and he grasped the ladder on the end of the car, thus preventing the inevitable which would certainly have resulted in death. But the trouble did not end with the descent. If the brake which he held in his hand should fall between the cars the train would be derailed. Finally he managed to get his feet on the buffer and in this position, holding on with one hand and the brake in the other, he arrived in the city.

LAST evening at the Opera House there was much interest to see the sleeper, who had an all day's repose in Messrs. Prowse Brothers window awakened out of his sleep. A simple snap of the fingers and "all right" from the operator did the work and the subject at once left to get something to eat. The class on the platform was under control of Mr. McEwen during the entire evening. They witnessed all sorts of sports which the audience could not see, making rare sport for the spectators at the same time. Again and again in the midst of their most active demonstrations the entire class was instantly frozen, in its momentary attitude with every muscle rigid and eyes fixed.
