A BIG MAJORITY IN FAVOR OF UNION.

HALIFAX, Oct. 26.—The oldest Presbyterian in the Dominion, that of Truro yesterday voted 13 to 1 in favor of Union.

Its chief business was the consideration of remits from the General Assembly, the principal item in which was the basis of a Union with the Methodist and Congregationalists. Most of the day was spent on this, practically every member speaking on the question.

FACULTY CONCERT MOUNT ALLISON LADIES' COLLEGE.

SACKVILLE, Oct. 22.—The Faculty concert of the Mount Allison's Ladies' College and Conservatory of Music, a function which has been anticipated with keen interest, was held last evening and was an unparalleled success. The concert this year was of exceptional interest owing to the presence of several new members on the various staffs. A large and enthusiastic audience greeted the performers and so persistently encored the numbers as to extend the program over a period of three hours.

Miss Smith was in her usual good voice. She is so well known to a Sackville audience that it would be superfluous to make further mention of her selections. Miss Munzing, recently appointed on the Conservatory staff, delighted her hearers. She is sweet, petite, and daintily charming on stage appearance, with a voice displaying much sympathy and beauty. Miss Munzing also took part in a quartette in which she and Miss Booth played a piano duet, Miss Ayer the violin and Prof. Pickard the organ.

In last evening's program the organ took a very prominent place, being used in combination with the various other instruments. Especially pleasing was the piano and organ duet in which Miss Fraser, as pianist, and Prof. Pickard, as organist, took part. Miss Fraser spent last summer studying in Paris and was never heard to better advantage. Prof. Robert Pickard, lately appointed Assistant-Director of the Conservatory, enraptured his audience with his organ selections. This instrument is Mr. Pickard's specialty, and his performance last evening proved him a master in this art.

The appearance of Miss Pydell, who was this summer appointed head of the Vocal Department, had been looked forward to with real interest and everyone was charmed with her rich, beautiful voice. Her tones are full and clear and she possesses a magnificent range. Miss Pydell sang several solos and was also heard in a duet with Miss Smith.

One is powerless to do credit to Miss Mitchell's number. In her presentation of "Joanne d'Arc" the audience lived for the time on the famous French battlefield. Miss Mitchell is wonderfully gifted and possesses marvellous magnetic power.

All knew what to expect when it was announced that Prof. Horsfall was to appear on the program. His performance last evening was characterized by his usual excellent finish and brilliancy.

BRISTOL SPEEDIEST OF BRITAIN'S CRUISERS.

LONDON, Oct. 26.—H. M. S. Bristol forms one of what is known as the "town" class of cruisers, and she has just developed on her trials the unprecedented speed of just under 27 knots, or, to be quite accurate, 26.84 knots, a speed greater than that so far obtained by any British war vessel other than torpedo craft.

A feature of no small interest connected with the trials of H. M. S. Bristol is the fact that the vessel is fitted with turbine engines, not, however, of the Parsons type, but of the Curtis type. The Bristol is fitted with two turbines, each of which is on a separate shaft, so that the vessel is of the ordinary twin screw type.

The Bristol has a displacement of 4,800 tons, and was designed to attain a speed of 25 knots when developing 22,000 s. h. p. On her eight hour full power trial, however, she developed a mean power of 24,227 s. h. p., and the speed of 25 knots was attained with 19,000 s. h. p., or 3,000 s. h. p. less than designed. It is expected that with the experience that will be gained in the future, even higher efficiency will be attained with the Curtis turbine which has already produced such good results in the Bristol.

BAD WEATHER IN THE WEST.

VANCOUVER, B. C., Oct. 26.—Fierce and destructive storms are sweeping over North Coast of British Columbia and Alaska, according to advices from Prince Rupert. Strong winds and heavy rains are causing havoc in the vicinity of terminus of Grand Trunk Pacific. Bridges are being swept away and telegraph and telephone lines torn down by wind and landslides. So far no lives have been lost.

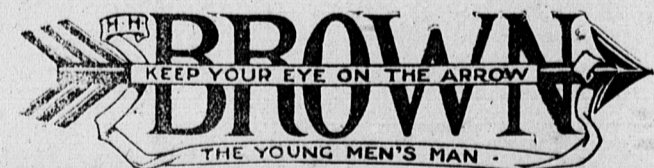
