Potato Inspection Results Are Noted

The inspection of potato fields entered for certification was begun in the Province on July 22, and inspectors report finding more mosaic than usual in some of the Green Mountain areas. In an advisory bulletin issued by Messrs. F. M. Cannon, Dominion entomological laboratory, and L. C. Calbeck, Dominion laboratory of plant pathology at Charlottetown, growers are advised to take disease counts before commencing to rogue. Fields that contain 4 per cent or more of virus diseases (leafroll and mosaic) should not be rogued.

HALIFAX, July 25 — (CP) — Official inland forecast issued by the Dominion Public Weather Office valid until midnight Monday.

Synopsis: On Sunday there were patches of cloud over the Maritime. After the early morning fog had lifted there was intermittent sunniness. In the evening there were some showers in New Brunswick and it was still raining north of the Gulf. In the southern regions the skies were nearly clear in places but along the coast there was considerable fog. An old disturbance in Northern Quebec is expected to cause continuing dull weather and rain in the northern sections. Dry air flowing into the district from the west will cover most of the southern regions and generally this weather can be expected there on Monday.

Regional Forecasts: Prince Edward Island: Variable cloudiness during the night. Monday clear with not much change in temperature. Light westerly winds. Low early Monday morning and high in the afternoon at Charlottetown, 58 and 72.
