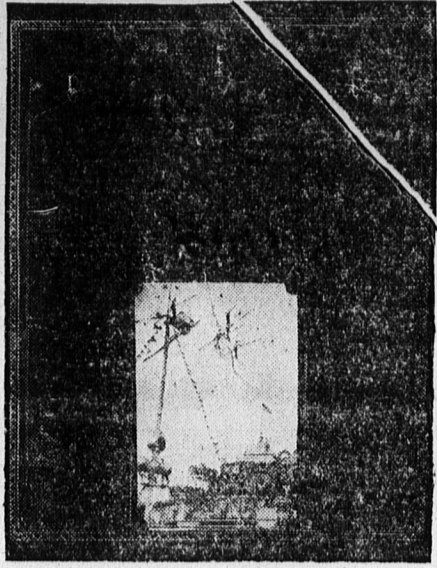

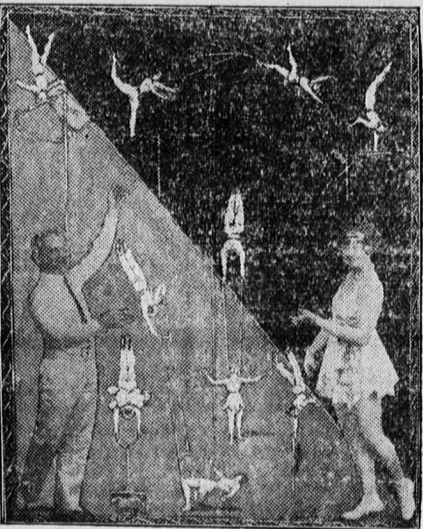
HUSTREI FAMILY

To Bring Capone Back to Chicago

CHICAGO, Aug. 19.—Al Capone was reported at police headquarters today to be en route from Federal penitentiary at Atlanta, Ga., to the Illinois State Prison at Joliet to be held there pending trial in Chicago on charges of racket conspiracy.

The report came as Federal and State authorities were preparing to go before Chief Justice John L. Prystalski of criminal court and ask for a habeas corpus writ to return Capone here.

Legal authorities said Capone and his co-defendants could be arraigned at any time on the conspiracy charges. A short delay probably would be granted, during which Capone would remain in the States penitentiary or the Cook County jail, they said, and then the trial could be begun.
