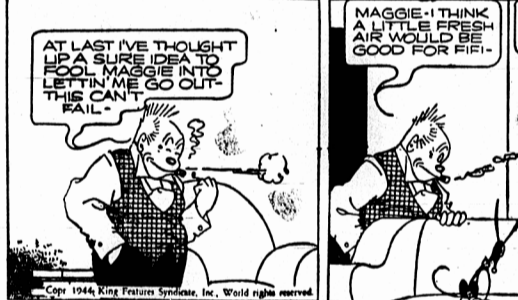

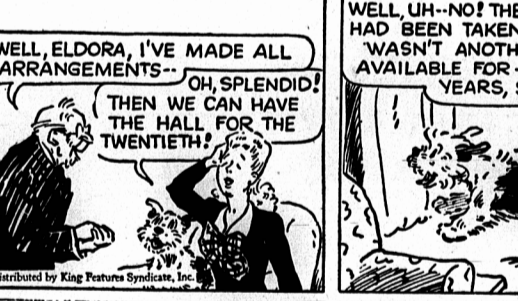

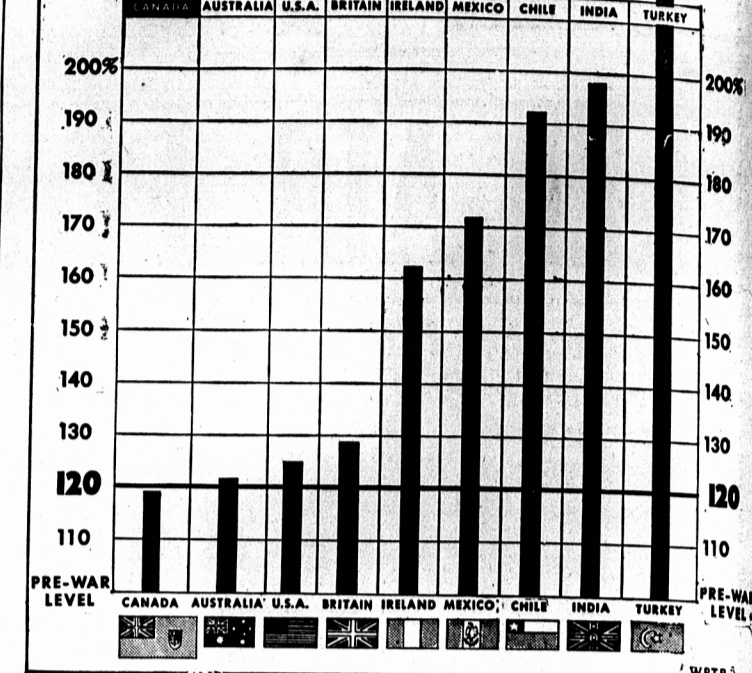


COURTING NO COMPETITION.
