The schooner Champion has arrived with a cargo of lumber for L. M. Poole & Co. The Champion encountered adverse winds, gales and other diversities of the elements on her voyage from Richibucto but has been safely docked after her various adventures.

To show the large amount of money sent out for farm products, Thos A. O'Brien says he paid out last year the sum of \$4555.00 for imported meats, that is meats from P. E. I., and Ontario, and other meat dealers paid out sums in like proportions—What a ready-to-door cash market is offered to farmers to raise beef cattle.—New Glasgow Enterprise.

Rev R. G. Fulton, of Woodstock, passed through the city last evening en route to Sackville. Mr Fulton has given up pastoral work for the space of two years and is now combining lumber dealing and newspaper work in the way of business. Since the first of the year he has been editor of the Carleton Sentinel. He has now, however, given up all intention of returning to church work. Mr Fulton is a native of the west side, and a son of the late Robert Fulton, of the Paris crew.—St John Telegraph. Mr Fulton formerly resided in this Province.

On Thursday afternoon last the trustees of Falconwood Asylum held an investigation regarding the death of George White, aged thirty, a patient who had passed away at noon the same day. The investigation was deemed necessary from the fact that the deceased had been struck on the head on May 12th, by another inmate while taking the usual exercise on the grounds in charge of the ward keepers. The deceased was suddenly attacked by his assailant with an iron hinge. The latter stealthily crept up and committed the assault while the deceased was lying down. It was done so quickly that before the keepers could wrest the hinge from him several severe blows had been struck. Although badly injured White had to all appearances almost recovered, the wounds being practically healed up. On Wednesday last, he was seized with pneumonia, which the doctors declared caused his death. After a thorough examination of all parties concerned the trustees decided that no negligence could be attributed to any person, as the attack was made in such a way, as to be really not preventible. White was lying on the ground with his head resting on his hand. The keeper was close by. The assailant struck three blows, in quick succession. Then the insane impulse over, he threw away the weapon as the keepers approached. He had been in the institution for about four years, and White for five.
