## THE SENATE AND REDISTRIBUTION.

The bald and spectacled veterans of the Senate, in the plenitude of their Conservatism and the fulness of their power, have rejected the Liberal Government's redistribution bill for the second time. Last year they "hoisted" it for six months and this year they have elevated it again in like manner for a term during which the moon may six times encircle the earth. And so it has befallen that a measure, intended by the people's elected representatives to have become law and to have taken full force and effect in time for the approaching elections, is dead as Julius Caesar, and nothing but a coroner's inquest can do it any good.

It had been believed by many persons, and this great journal of the family, looking upon such matters from the lofty heights and clear atmosphere of independence, had shared in the belief—that matters pertaining to the House of Commons exclusively, as to the qualification of its members, the qualification of the voters by whom they were to be elected and the size and shape of the electoral divisions which they are to canvass and for which they shall sit, were matters which might properly be left to the Commons to fix and determine. Why should the venerable Senators intermeddle in such affairs? For they themselves have no constituencies, neither are they voted for at all; they put up no election deposits; take no chances of defeat; kiss no dirty babies and toil not neither do they spin yarns in the electoral campaign. No election judges can unseat them from the red cushions of the Senate, or mulct them in inconvenient and exasperating bills of costs; no power on earth can deprive them of the mileage which pays their board bills, the trunks of stationery which the retail stationers are eager to buy, or the life "indemnity" which they salt down.

Age cannot wither their right to legislate, nor custom stale the infinite variety of prurient details in the divorce trials of which they hold a parliamentary monopoly. They have their own bar at which to drink in venerable seclusion and they are never summoned to the bar of public opinion. Convenient adjournments of two or three weeks at a time, and from time to time repeated, tide over the tedium of the session, while between adjournments sittings of thirty minutes suffice as the labors of a day. The otherwise obtrusive public does not obtrude itself into their galleries, nor does the proletariat struggle for admittance at the doors of their stately halls. The atmosphere of the Red Chamber is wholly uncorrupted by the tainted breath of the multitude. And if peradventure, frivolity should ever peep within, it is only to turn quickly away and ponder upon the last chapter of Ecclesiastes.

Why should these men, thus comfortably placed to repose in the political Valhalla, strain their octogenarian muscles, pulling the ropes to hoist William Mulock's bill to the rafters of oblivion? And why, having once performed this arduous task, should they one year later and one year older, in "lean and slippered pantaloons" repeat the Herculean labor? All we know is that they have done it! And a Government of All the Talents, backed by a big majority, stands thwarted defeated, and powerless before them. Great and mighty is Sir Wilfrid Laurier, graceful and oratorical withal, the chosen chieftain of a mighty people. He has bowed in the presence of condescending royalty, of rank honored by his recognition and of beauty flattered by his notice. He has sent a little army to South Africa, has given Britain a potential preference in our markets and has bearded, so to speak, the bald eagle of America in his ery at Washington, but he cannot in all all his puissance alter the bounds of the smallest electoral division in Canada! The Senate has spoken and he must submit.

And not only Sir Wilfrid, and his ministers and the majority of the Commons, but the people of Canada must submit. In this matter a million electors do not count. All the machinery of our representative system is paralyzed. The Senate rules, and rules alone, and the Senate has decreed that the shameful gerrymander of 1882 shall remain in force till the light of the twentieth century shines upon the ruin wrought by that prodigious landslide. "Men and brethren! These things ought not so to be."

## Mary's Lamb as a Pioneer.

For a hundred years children have been taught that the historic Mary was a fit object for scorn and derision for taking her lamb to school.

But, sooner or later, history justifies most pioneers and innovators. Now we are told, on no less authority than that of Dr. Edward Everett Hale, that pets ought to be kept in every schoolhouse. Not only lambs but cats, dogs, and rabbits should be allowed to follow their masters to school, to the end that all the pupils may learn the lesson of kindness to the lower animals.

It will be remembered in the case of Mary's lamb that "at last the teacher turned it out, but still it lingered near," waiting for Mary to come out at recess. Dr. Hale is of opinion that teachers instead of driving away pet animals, ought to provide them so that the small boy pupils, instead of tying tin cans on the tails of stray dogs, may feed the rabbits and stroke the soft fur of poor pussy.

That Dr. Hale practices what he preaches is shown by the fact that he has provided comfortable sleeping apartments for no less than thirteen stray cats under his front veranda. He finds that these cats, having a warm place in which to sleep, no longer practice sonatas on his woodshed at midnight, and he suggests people who are now troubled by nocturnal feline music will find his remedy more effectual than the bootjacks and old shoes which are usually prescribed.

But the important fact in connection with Dr. Hale's dictum is that poor Mary, at whose folly we have all smiled, was in reality a pioneer, born before her time, and therefore an object of derision on the part of the dense and unenlightened public. But with recent years methods of school management and discipline have changed so rapidly that no modern Mary need fear she will be unappreciated. In fact it would not be especially surprising if the throwing of paper wads in school hours should be advocated on the ground that the practice tends to the development of quickness of eye and sureness of aim.

## Honey's Advice Helped.

When Lord Kitchener joined the Royal Engineers, now nearly 30 years ago, he was a tall, slim, very handsome young man. The ex-sirdar did not at first take to the army, but had serious thoughts of going on the stage, and was one day, while in London, introduced by a comrade to the late George Honey. Young Kitchener consulted George on the subject of his histrionic ambition. Honey looked critically at the officer and remarked, "I could get you an engagement in five minutes as a walking gentleman, but, let me tell you, you'd be better off as a sapper in engineers." Then very seriously, Honey gave the other an insight into the seamy side of an actor's life, and finished with the advice: "Stick to the army, Mr Kitchener: it's a better shop than the boards!" Had Kitchener cut the service and joined the "profession" history might have been differently written.
