## Appointed As Assistant Professor



MR. H. PEARSON GUNDY

Mr. H. Pearson Gundy, of Toronto has been appointed Assistant Professor in English at Mount Allison University. Mr. Gundy received his B. A. degree from Toronto University in 1928. In 1929 he was Instructor in English at Victoria University, and in 1930 he was granted his M. A. by Toronto. From 1931 to 1935 he was Lecturer in English at McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario, and at the present time is completing residence for his Ph.D. degree at the University of Chicago.

Mr. Gundy married Dorothy, daughter of Dr. James Endicott, General Secretary of Foreign Missions for the United Church of Canada. Mrs. Gundy was born in China while Dr. Endicott was a Missionary there. Mr. Gundy, who comes to Mount Allison with high recommendations, should prove a worthy successor to Professor A. W. Trueman who has been made head of the department, following Dr. W. M. Tweedie, who has resigned after half a century of teaching service.

Mrs. Maggie Plover returned recently to her home at St. Peters Road after spending the winter months visiting friends in Boston, Mass.

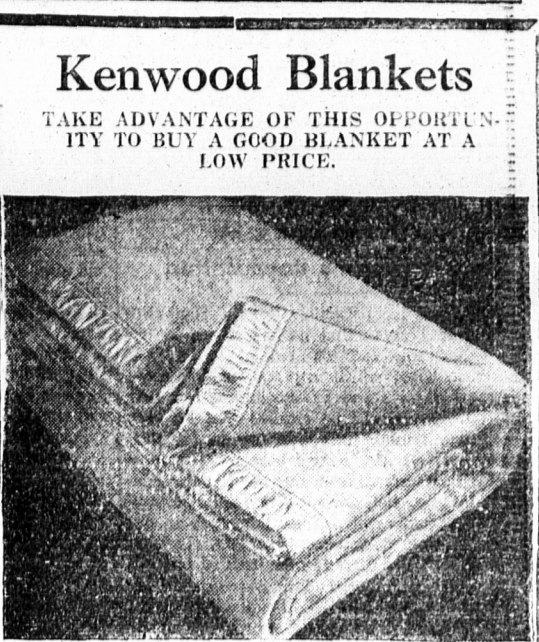
Congratulations are extended to Messrs George Dewar and Fred Martin, New Perth who spent a very successful year at P.W.C.

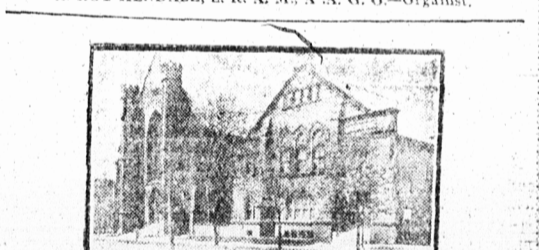

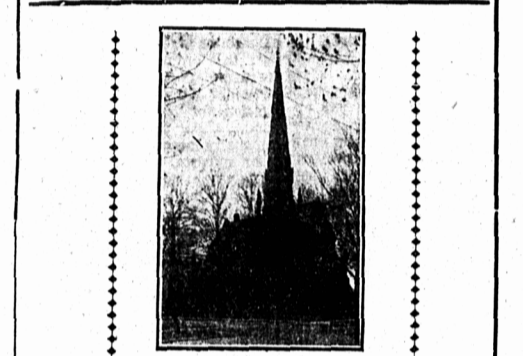
