Senator Duff Heard Before Synod Meeting

Militant on the floors of the Canadian Parliament and on the hustings, Senator William Duff, of Lunenburg, N. S., colorful figure in Canadian politics, was not a bit less docile when he stood before the delegates to the Maritime Synod to extend personal support on a resolution dealing with war passed by that body.

SHOULD BE OPPOSED

"Every Christian, whether living in Canada or the British Isles, should be opposed to the forces in Europe which have brought on this war," he declared. An elder of the Presbyterian Church in Lunenburg, and a delegate to the Synod, Senator Duff was called to the platform and asked to speak on the resolution. "This," he said in opening, "is an important resolution for the Synod to deal with."
