Canadiens Jump Into Lead Canadian Section

Joe Lamb Scores Three Goals As Bruins Win; Hawks Blank Americans 2-0.

FORUM, Montreal, Nov. 23.—Montreal Canadiens spurred into the lead of the Canadian Section of the National Hockey League here tonight when they defeated Ottawa Senators 1-0. The "Flying Frenchmen" went a point ahead of Toronto Maple Leafs in the standing as the Leafs had an off night. Ottawa remained anchored in a tie for third position with Montreal Maroons.

Canadiens had the better of the play throughout and showed a light defence to register their second consecutive shut-out victory.

Ottawa played a fast game but were unable to get their passing attacks started and most of their rushes ended in grief at the Canadian defence. Twelve penalties were handed out during the game, Aurel Jollat, diminutive left winger of Canadiens drawing three in the first period.

The Canadiens' goal came as the direct result of an Ottawa penalty. With Cooney Weiland warming the penalty bench Canadiens sent four men to the attack, peppering Beveridge in the Ottawa nets with shots from all angles.
