SUMMERSIDE BOARD OF TRADE

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

This evening marks the thirtieth birthday of the Summerside Board of Trade. Thirty years ago the merchants and business men of Summerside realized that there were problems affecting the welfare of their town which could be satisfactorily dealt with only by cooperative effort.

Organization was necessary and this step was taken on January 25, 1900. The record reads that 58 business men of various occupations subscribed their names as Charter Members. It is worthy of note that of that number three still retain active membership.

Early in the year a proposition was made to the Town Council by an outside Corporation which desired to purchase the Municipal Lighting System. In this the citizens generally were interested and those engaged in business particularly so.

Your Board is affiliated with the Associated Boards of Trade of Prince Edward Island, the Maritime Board of Trade, and the Canadian Chamber of Commerce.

We are interested in the work accomplished by the Maritime Provinces' Trade Commissioner at Toronto. In July, Mr. Burnaby visited this Province and was our guest at a luncheon at the Queen Hotel.
