FRANCE PLAYING IN WITH GREAT BRITAIN

Sensation—Was Caused in French Senate—Member Charged Government With Playing Into the Hands of England—Report That Convention Between Countries Has been Signed

Paris, November 22.—Senator Gaudin De Villaine created a sensation in the senate to-day by making a vicious attack on the foreign and interior policy of the government. After expressing regret at the fact that the Catholics had not the courage to reply to their persecutors as the terrorists did in Russia, M. D. Villaine charged the government with playing into the hands of Great Britain and demanded to know whether the report that a military convention had been signed between Great Britain and France as a prelude to the great advance, Minister Pichon and War Minister Pichon, had embarked with Premier Clemenceau, was true.

M. Clemenceau, in reply, after warmly defending M. Pichon and General Piquart, announced that he could not say anything regarding the Franco-British understanding.

SHOT IN BRAIN GIRL LIVES ON

MUSCATINE, Ia., Nov. 21.—Without knowing that it was her father who shot her or that he was in jail for the crime, 16-year-old Beasie Holsten died after living for five weeks with two bullets in her brain. Her last words were an inquiry for "papa."

The case of Beasie Holsten has been one of the most remarkable in medical annals and has attracted much attention from the profession. One of the bullets in the girl's brain severed the optic nerve, rendering her totally blind, yet she recovered and convalesced and acted in a perfectly rational manner and suffered no inconvenience from her wounds beyond the loss of her vision.

By all the rules of medicine, the girl should have been dead long ago, but she refused to die, and up to within a few hours of her final taking off had been conscious and perfectly rational.

The cause of the shooting was the refusal of Beasie to accompany her father to Indiana, where he wished to go to live with another daughter. The shooting took place on a public street early in the evening. The man attempted to take his own life, but inflicted only a trivial wound.

SAY CHRIST WAS GOOD TO HERETICS

DETROIT, Nov. 15.—Bishop Charles D. Williams, of the Episcopal diocese of Michigan, to-day in his opening address to the diocesan annual convention, said that men had never been won by arguments of either renunciation, persecution or heretics.

"Even in extreme cases," he said, "I do not believe in the weapons of excommunication or deposition for purely intellectual errors."

Bishop Williams cited passages of the New Testament to show that Paul did not excommunicate the Corinthians who denied any resurrection, and that Christ did not banish the agnostic Thomas from the college of the apostles.

Bishop Williams said if a clergyman or layman came to him professing belief in the incarnation, but interpreting the article of the Virgin birth differently from his (the bishop's) own interpretation, he would not denounce the man and call him a liar and blasphemous and bound him out of the Church, but would say, rather, "Come, and let us reason together."
