Austria Now A Spendthrift Nation Says U. S. Visitor

WICHITA FALLS, Texas, Oct. 23.—Austria is a nation of spendthrifts and the one characteristic for which Austrians were noted—frugality—has almost entirely disappeared since the war, according to Professor Ernest Katz, who has just returned to this city from a three months' visit overseas.

Most everyone has a job, Katz explained, but instead of saving a part of their earnings, the Austrians are busily engaged in spending it as rapidly as they make it. The chief occupation is eating and drinking, according to Professor Katz, who said that cafes and drinking places are crowded constantly with persons whose sole aim, apparently, is to spend their entire salary for food or liquor.

As for living conditions and prices, a five-room apartment house rents on an average for 140,000 crowns, but is very cheap, Professor Katz pointed out, since a glass of beer costs 2,700 crowns. Industries in Austria are in a very run-down condition, due to a lack of a domestic market and the high cost on exported finished products.

One of the interesting sights about Vienna, Professor Katz said, is the large number of bootblacks on the streets, nearly all of whom are crippled war veterans to whom the Government has granted a small space on the street with permission to conduct a shoe-shining business.

Vienna, he said, is rapidly taking on its old life.
