Stock Prices Are Continuing Recovery Drive

NEW YORK, Oct. 7—(AP)—The stock market chalked up another gain in its October recovery drive today.

The advance carried the general price level to a high since early September when quotations dropped sharply for two days running. Volume expanded on the way up, tended to contract as a rising price curve leveled off. Turnover of 800,000 shares compared with 710,000 Wednesday and was tops for the month thus far.

The Associated Press average of 60 stocks advanced 4 of one point to 68.6, the highest since 69 was scored on Sept. 8. The rise continued the upward trend which has been interrupted only once since the first of the month.

At Toronto

TORONTO, Oct. 7—(CP)—Base metals jumped ahead in brisk trading on the Toronto Stock Exchange today to touch a new high in more than two years on the exchange's index at 104.52—a gain of 1.91 and the highest figure since Feb. 1946.

Base metals showed only two losses as five issues touched new highs for the year on strong advances. Waite Amulet and Noranda were gone gainers for new highs apparently on the expected announcement of their buying into Mining Corporation which controls Quomont. International Nickel firmed fractionally and Consolidated Smelters advanced \$1.50 at \$117. Falconbridge, Labrador, Noranda, Pender Orelle, Sherriert Gordon and Silver Miller rose 5 to 20 cents.

At Montreal

MONTREAL, Oct. 7—(CP)—Active trading pushed securities on the Montreal Stock Exchange and Curb Market on a continued firm trend started a few days ago. Gains ranged from fractions to as much as 1-1/2 points. There were numerous turnovers of more than 1,000 shares each.

Papers were again the feature, together with metals and oils. Gains narrowly edged out losses in dull mine dealings. Canadian Vickers Ltd., following payment of a \$70 a share dividend, touched a new high of 199, then slipped 1-1/4 for a net gain of 1-1/2 points. The common rose 1-1/4 at 41.

Industrial sales were approximately 58,000 shares, an increase of 5,400 shares over yesterday's total. Mining turnover was 106,100 shares, compared with 62,900 shares in the preceding session.

At London

LONDON, Oct. 7—(Reuters)—Although trading was slow, prices in most sections of the Stock Exchange remained firm today.

The recent rise in the gilt-edged market was continued although buying was on a smaller scale. Prices of 1-1/2 to 1-8 points, shown but transport three-per-cent remained steady at 99 15-16. Since its issue on the nationalization of British railways, this stock has yet to reach par.

Newsman Gives Impressions Of Trieste

TRIESTE, Oct. 7—(AP)—The Allied Military Government in Trieste apparently devotes itself largely to insuring that outside forces do not interfere with Trieste's self-government.

The Anglo-American armed forces are unobtrusive, representing a guard rather than a police force. The units are stationed mostly in the mountains outside the city, and the real work of policing is done by the V.G. (Venetian Giulia) Police. As far as I can learn, there is no agitation among the local populace, for an end to the occupation, and no friction.

Such army units as you see give the impression of spit and polish, and of alertness. Until recently, they were turned constantly toward Yugoslavia, where 100,000 Communist troops represented a menace. This menace has been largely eliminated, since Tito no longer has the support of the Russians.

Russian-sponsored Yugoslavs are not exactly what you'd call an easy life, however. Making yourself familiar with the ground round Trieste, as an army must do, is a rather rugged proposition. Never have I seen such rocky terrain. It's difficult to walk with-out a turned ankle. From a distance you wonder at the great stone walls surrounding the tiny cultivated patches and forming a net-like pattern through the area.

Up close, and see why. There's nothing else to do with the stone, which must be moved to clear the ground.
