Fine Art School Planned at Banff

EDMONTON, April 1.—(C.P.)—A school of fine art, believed to be one of the first in Canada, will be established at Banff, Alta., by the Extension Department, University of Alberta.

Under direction of Mr. E. A. Corbett the school will be conducted from August 3 to 29. It will include divisions for study of theatre, music, and art. In previous years a summer school of the theatre only has been held. Widening of the school's scope has been made possible through the Carnegie Foundation.

Art classes will be in charge of Mr. J. Leighton of the Calgary Institute of Technology. Dr. Joseph Smith, president of the International Council of Speech and assistant director of the Department of Dramatics, University of Utah, will direct the theatre classes. Instructors from New York will give classes in act, dancing, and direction. Classes for children will be included in the syllabus.


