LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

House met at 3 40 p. m.

HON. JAMES RICHARDS introduced a bill to incorporate the Britannia Hall Co. of Tyne Valley. It was read a first time and set down for second reading Monday.

HON. MR. McNUTT reported that the bill to incorporate the Freeland Hall Co. was of a private nature and that a fee be charged.

The House resolved itself into committee of the whole on the act to incorporate Carter & Co., Ltd., with Mr. Godkin in the chair.

The bill was reported agreed to and set down for third reading on Monday.

HON. MR. ROGERS in resuming the debate on the motion to go into committee on The Dominion Packing Company Exemption bill contended there was nothing in the bill that affected the Province at large. We had a demand from the City Council to exempt the Company. The City possessed power to exempt for five years and when they got that power they might have got it for twenty or fifty years. Now they come and ask for the House to exempt the Company, and the great agitation is only because it is feared the D. P. Co. will stand in the way of a few people in the City who wish to manipulate the market. The Board of Trade had raised a howl, not because they feared a monopoly, but because they fear competition. The butcher, the baker and the sausage maker are afraid their business will be ruined. The Company will expend large sums of money, attract industries and employ labor. Clear of those directly affected it is certain that all classes will gain by the advent of the company. The farmers will benefit by increased stock and fruit raising for which they will get better markets. One paper in the province has done everything to discourage the Company. This is not as it should be. Our capital lies in our banks, uninvested and we need enterprise from abroad. He was not entirely in accord with the bill. But when we were asked to exempt a new hotel there was not a dissenting voice. Now a bus and cry is raised and it is said we are discriminating. He thought the voice of the City Council should be listened to in preference to that of a meeting. The bill can be amended in committee or a new bill made. In his opinion the city should itself grant the exemption instead of the Government granting it.

HON. MR. PETERS said he did not know the honorable gentlemen had any reference to this bill.

MR. McLEAN said the honorable members had this bill specially in mind.

MR. McLEAN, to put the matter right, moved the adjournment of the debate.

HON. MR. WHEAR thought it was only fair to him that the bill should not again be put off.

HON. MR. GORDON said two of the members of the Opposition were absent by leave and he understood from them that the Leader of the Government had given them the assurance that no important bill would come up.

HON. MR. PETERS said he did not know the honorable gentlemen had any reference to this bill.

MR. McLEAN said the honorable members had this bill specially in mind.

MR. McLEAN, to put the matter right, moved the adjournment of the debate.

HON. MR. WHEAR thought it was only fair to him that the bill should not again be put off.

MR. McLEAN's motion that the debate be adjourned was carried.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Whear the House resolved itself into committee of the whole with Mr. McLaughlin in the chair on the bill to consolidate and amend the Acts incorporating the City of Charlottetown.

House adjourned at 6 p. m.

EVENING SESSION.

House met at 8 o'clock.

The House resolved itself into committee to consider the bill to consolidate and amend the Charlottetown Incorporation Act.

House adjourned at 10 o'clock.
