It appears a fox was accidentally killed through falling into a ditch and the carcass was not recovered for several days, when the meat was fed to Mr. Milligan's foxes. Several became ill and died, and a veterinary examination showed they had succumbed to ptomaine. The actual number has not been ascertained but it is reported to be about twenty.
