Up to that time the kid would have had a fit if I had even looked at a man as a prospective stepfather for him. Anyway, it set me thinking that if young men need wives, perhaps middle-aged mothers need husbands.

ANSWER: Out of the mouths of babes and sucklings proceedeth wisdom, says the Good Book, and no woman was ever offered better advice than that given by this youthful Solomon who wants to see his mother free because he wants to be free himself.

When a woman is left a widow with a houseful of youngsters to rear, she confronts the most complicated problem on earth. She has to have the softness of a mother and the firmness of a father in dealing with her kids. She has to be a slave who toils night and day to give them every possible advantage. She has to be a martyr who sacrifices all of her own personal tastes and desires to those of her children. How Can I !!!

Q. How can I make cleaning fluid odorless?

Cook's Corner

CHINESE MEAT BALLS

- 1/4 pound ground beef
1 cup white rice
1 teaspoon salt
3 tablespoons fat
1 cup diced onion
1 cup diced celery
1 cup sliced carrots
2 cups cooked lima beans
1 cup beef broth, or that made with a bouillon cube or that which comes from a can as consommé
2 tablespoons cornstarch
1 tablespoon chill sauce
3/4 cup water

Melt fat. Add salt to meat. Make meat into small balls. Brown balls in fat. Add onion and cook until tender. Add celery, carrots, lima beans and broth. Cover and cook for 15 minutes. Blend cornstarch, chill sauce and water. Add to hot mixture and stir until thick and thoroughly blended. By this time the meat balls will be cooked and tender and all will be ready to be poured onto a bed of hot fluffy rice.

REST OF THE LUNG CURES TUBERCULOSIS

Although tuberculosis of the lungs still causes many deaths, the general public reads and hears so much about how the battle against tuberculosis is being won that they do not know that tuberculosis is still common. I have spoken about visiting a friend in a sanitarium as a heavy-weight boxer was whistled into an adjoining bed. The latter explained that he had disregarded a severe cold, tuberculosis had developed, and he was now prepared to "rest" for two years to obtain a "cure."

It is the long rest necessary to bring about a cure that prompted specialists in tuberculosis to try to obtain rest for the affected lung by means of surgery. If the lung can be rested, the natural resistance of the body is usually sufficient to fight or kill off the organisms.
