Mr. Murchison will probably commence his visits in provincial districts this week or next. He succeeds Rev. J. S. Porter, who combined in his district as secretary of the Bible Society, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland as well as New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island. Two secretaries now carry on the work in the separated districts.
