## OTHER FIRMS SUFFERED IN THE BIG FIRE OF THURSDAY NIGHT

It was not until 2 o'clock yesterday morning that the "all-out" bell sounded for the big fire in Grant & Kennedy's building at the corner of Queen and Sydney Streets. At 4 a. m. the firemen were again summoned to the scene, the fire having broken out afresh among the smouldering debris. In about half an hour it was extinguished. In addition to Grant & Kennedy's building the Connolly Building alongside also suffered badly. The upper part of this building was occupied by the Charlottetown Herald, Mr. James McIsaac, editor. The plant is practically ruined, a great quantity of water having found its way into the building, the plaster falling from the ceiling among the type, etc and making a bad mess of everything. The business office was also badly damaged. Mr. McIsaac is at present in Ottawa and nothing could be learned as to how he stands in the matter of insurance. Beneath the Herald office was the P. E. I. Dry Goods Store, conducted by Mr. Simon Joseph. His stock was considerably damaged by water and smoke. There was \$1,500 insurance. The store of R.F. Maddigan also sustained some damage by water. There was insurance for \$1,800. The estimated damage to the Connolly Building, the whole roof of which was burned, is placed in the vicinity of \$4,000. There was insurance for this amount, all of which will be required to make repairs. Grant & Kennedy's loss in stock is estimated at \$10,000 with \$6,000 insurance. The building which was owned by Mr. Grant was valued at about \$5,000. It was insured for \$3,000. The building contained, besides the other damaged goods, referred to, about \$15,000 worth of the International Harvester Co's goods. This loss was fairly well covered by that company. The total damage by the fire is about \$20,000.
