New Hit, 'Chicken Every Sunday,' Stars Dan Dailey, Celeste Holm

Capitalizing on the entertainment trend set with "Miracle on 34th Street," "Sitting Pretty" and "Apartment For Peggy," Twentieth Century-Fox has produced another delightful and heart-warming comedy in "Chicken Every Sunday," which previewers are claiming will be the best of them all. Starring Dan Dailey and Celeste Holm, the film opens Monday at the Prince Edward Theatre.

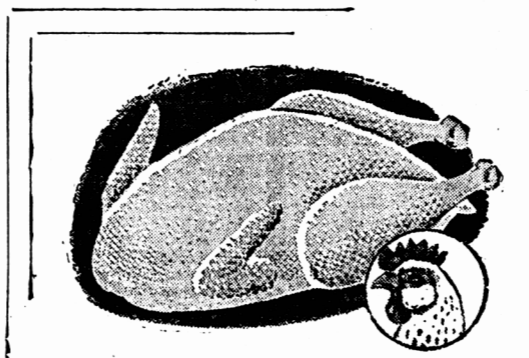
