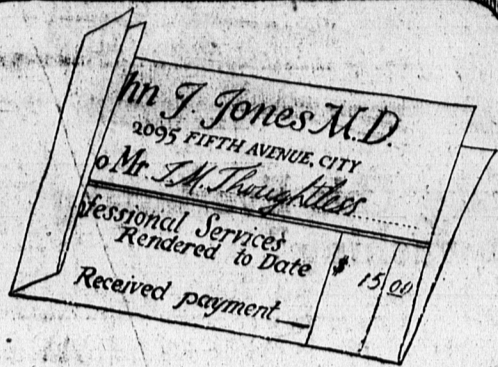

Miss Ross, Superintendent of the Hospital then told much of interest regarding the difficulties of carrying on the work under present conditions, high prices and the influenza epidemic. Mrs. Simpson, President, then moved a vote of thanks to the visiting ladies. This motion was seconded by Mrs. James B. Profit and carried unanimously by the meeting. 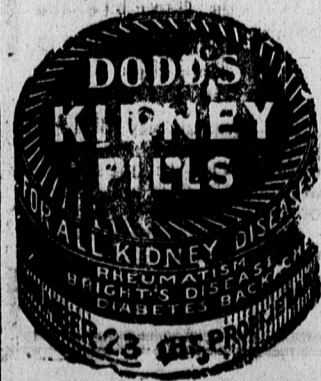
