

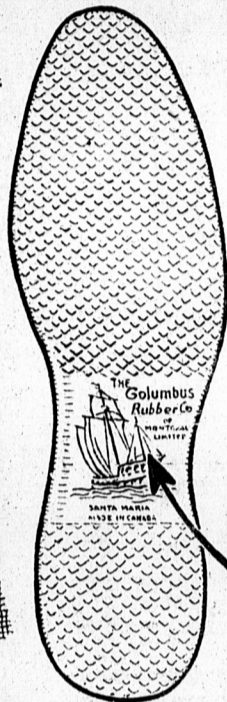

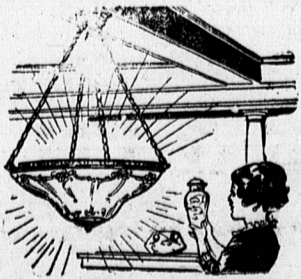

Maine and Rhode Island Mills Cut

Wages A Factor In Fixing the Express Rates

Boston, Dec. 14—All of the textile mills of Maine and practically all in the Rhode Island will put in effect on Dec. 20th a 12-15 per cent wage reduction announced today in Lawrence, Lowell and New Bedford and in many smaller New England mill centres. The reduction will eventually apply to about 300,000 operatives. The posting of notices of the reduction at the largest cotton mills in Lawrence today was duplicated in a large number of Massachusetts (Maine and Rhode Island cities) The Amiskag mills of Manchester (N. H.) the largest cotton plant in the world and other mills in New Hampshire have not yet made any announcement as to a reduction. At Fall River, one of the principal textile centres, manufacturers and union labor leaders are conducting negotiations regarding wages.

William W. Wood, president of the American Woolen Company, which operates fifty-seven mills in New England and New York State said today that he had no statement to make at present on the matter of wages.

Ottawa, Dec. 14—The importance of wages paid to employees as a factor in fixing express rates, was emphasized by Hon. F. B. Carvell, chief commissioner this morning, when the application of express companies for forty per cent increase in rates was again before the Board of Railway Commissioners. The final stage of the case that of argument by counsel had been reached, and Hon. F. H. Phippen counsel for the express traffic Association was setting forth the reasons why the application should be granted. When the Chief Commissioner asked:

"How long are wages going to remain at their present level? It is said that everything else is coming down. When are wages coming down too?" Mr. Phippen found it impossible to answer the question, and the chief commissioner went on to say that high wages were a most important factor in express rates. "I wish the public would realize this," he said. "There are objections on the part of the public rate increases, but the public doesn't ask that wages be brought down."

Mr. Carvell was also curious to see what Mr. Phippen thought the express business would amount to in 1921. "The claim is made," he said, "that living costs are coming down to normal. Why should express rates be increased when other things are coming down?" Although unable to forecast next year's business, Mr. Phippen said that obviously the revenue from 1920 and good shipments would be much reduced next year. Argument in the express rates case was adjourned at 5 o'clock this evening until Tuesday afternoon because tomorrow the Railway Commission will confer with the representatives of the various bodies interested in the general freight rates inquiry shortly to be commenced, and which will deal with the question of discriminatory rates as between the East and the West as well as other matters. A large array of counsel and business men from all parts of the Dominion is expected to arrive in the morning and many suggestions as to the proper method of procedure to be adopted will likely be made.
