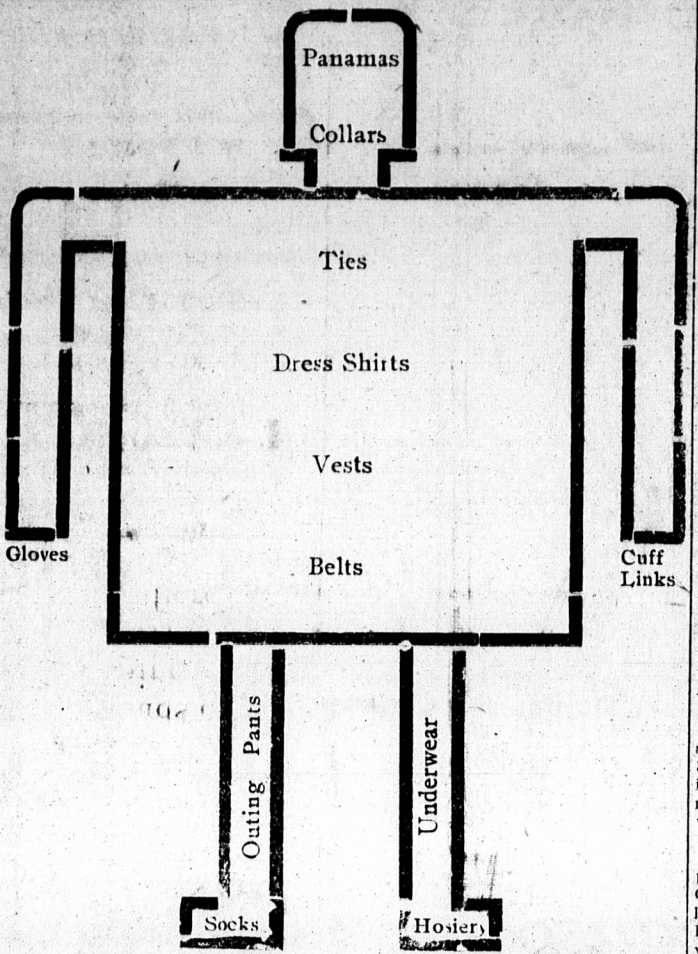

Perennials Wintered Over. (Large Clump plants) Pansy, Daisy, Carnations, Phlox, Sweet William, Forgetment and Hollyhocks 5c each 50c per doz.
Vegetable Plants—Extra early transplanted cabbage plants 50c per hundred. Late cabbage plants 12c per hundred. (Ready about 15th June.
Calli's wer and Celery 75c per hundred. Late tomato plants 20c per doz. Extra early tomato plants 40c per doz. Cucumber 15c per doz. Pumpkin and squash 20c per doz.
We mail annuals postage free, but perennials add 1c each extra.
