Women Go Far To Glimpse Famed Sheikh

(United Press) TANGIER, Morocco, June 17.—Raisuli, the Robin Hood of Morocco, who inspired John Hay's "Perdicaris alive or Raisuli dead," which provoked wild applause in the Republican National convention at Chicago 20 years ago, has ceased to be a great international issue. He has become almost a legend. Raisuli has quit kidnapping prominent Englishmen and Americans for ransom, and is living in retirement at Tazrut, in the heart of Morocco, surrounded by faithful followers whom he supports from the proceeds of his years of brigandage and the funds Germany applied to him for the purpose of keeping the anti-French native tribes in a state of ferment during the great war. Ian Percidaris, the wealthy American whom Raisuli kidnapped from his villa in Tangier and carried into the Atlas Mountains, died in the United States several years ago. Sir Harry Maclean, the English chief of the sultan's bodyguard, was kidnapped and held prisoner for seven months. Raisuli has been forgotten by newspaper readers. But Raisuli is such a picturesque figure that even in retirement he is not forgotten. There are frequent rumors that the former bandit may be induced to enter the movies. Foreign women make pilgrimages to Tazrut in the hope of seeing a sheik in real life. Political differences between Spain, France, England and Germany as to which should have the whip hand in directing Moroccan affairs played into Raisuli's hands. He was clever enough to capitalize on the international rows and because of his great influence with the mountain tribes has managed to escape death.

Star Of Office Mousers is Equitable's 'Minnie'

(United Press) NEW YORK, June 17.—Defying the patents and contraptions of man, "Minnie," the world's largest office building's veteran mouse exterminator, is given preference and a rating of "supreme" in the rodent-trapping field by C. T. Coley, operating manager of the Equitable building here. "Minnie" is but one of many cats whose prowess in their instinctive work is commended in reports of building managers to the National Association of Building Owners and Managers. In each case they are regarded as a part of the operating equipment, and their care requires the full services of an attendant. Respectable living quarters and the privilege of using the elevators are other conveniences afforded these workers. In the case of "Minnie," Mr. Coley says: "Her work has been very effective in keeping the Equitable building free from mice for six years. Her cost has been practically nothing. When a mouse is discovered Minnie is installed in the room until the next morning, after which there are no further complaints. "Minnie has learned to place herself in front of elevator gates and wait until the door opens. She then steps in the car and rides to an upper floor where she 'meows' when she wishes to get off. She returns by the same route to her headquarters on the fourth floor late in the afternoon to be fed. In the evening, when not on duty, she uses the elevator to go to the main floor, so that she may go out later in the evening she returns. "Minnie is very proud of her job and will not tolerate a companion cat to come into the building."

Germany Fast Regaining Trade With Argentina

(United Press) BUENOS AIRES, June 13.—The German flag ranked an easy second in Argentina's trade before the war and, despite the surrender of the German mercantile marine, it has almost regained that position since the signing of the peace treaty, according to shipping statistics just published. The premier place is still held by the British whose vessels at present handle about 45 per cent of Argentina's foreign trade. It probably will be a close thing between the Italians and Germans as to who will occupy second place in Argentina's carrying trade this year, but it is believed that the Germans will win back their old position in the course of two or three years as every month sees a new German liner in these waters. France and the United States would appear to be dropping back in the race. Germans are migrating by thousands to Argentina, which affords special incentives and attractions for them. Quite a number of German colonies are springing up, especially in north Argentina, and these create a natural trade with their homeland. Also they give plenty of scope for expansion to the German steamship lines, who also have been lately specializing in what may be termed second class or one class passenger steamers. German vessels today bring the greater proportion of north European passengers to Argentina.

MY NEIGHBOR SAYS
If you have a waxed finish on the living room floor and wish to clean it put a few drops of crude oil on a soft dry cloth and give the surface a light polishing after having dusted it well with a dry cloth.
To remove the cloudiness which comes over highly polished furniture, wash it with a sponge and tepid water and rub it dry with a wet chamok wrung out of cold water. A dry chamok streaks the surface and does not remove the blur.
When you pour water off boiled potatoes save it and use it instead of water or milk for your bread, sponge or coffee cake. If the water is saved you will require a little less salt when mixing dough.

International Students Aided By League Bureau

(United Press) GENEVA, June 13.—Useful information concerning world universities is contained in the first quarterly publication of the international office of university intelligence, which was recently created as a new co-operative feature of the League of Nations. These publications will endeavor to co-ordinate in compact form international university information and fulfill the purpose of the new office, which is that of serving as a bridge between the higher institutions of learning in all countries. They will relate the exchange of professors and students, list the books of interest to university people, and catalogue the administrative measures adopted by various universities concerning the conditions under which foreigners may follow courses of study, explain scholarships, the tuition conditions affecting foreigners and set forth the special courses which may be open to them. The first number of the review publishes the results of an inquiry among international students' associations on an organization for the exchange of students from one country to another; the conditions under which students work abroad and questions touching university courses in general. Under the heading "university information" appears the text of a convention on the mutual exchange of students between five countries of Central America, communications offices of the United States, England, Denmark, Spain, France, Holland and Switzerland, and notices from various international associations of students.
