The facts are these: people are considerably better off in world's goods than they were twenty years ago. As a rule they are not in debt. The reasons are that while farming is growing less and less productive fishing has grown fully twice as productive as twenty years ago. What is lacking in farming is made up by fishing. The harvest of the sea, mostly lobsters, in the East Point district is a big item—a great asset. With the cost of supplies almost cut in two wages reduced the prospect for the Eastern Lobster packers looks considerably brighter than for the past two years.
