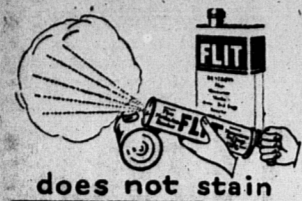

LONDON, May 23.—For the second time in three years the metropolitan police commissioner, Sir William Herwood, has issued a special notice to all the taxicab drivers with regard to the location of Clarence House, the residence of the Duke of Connaught, "as the commissioner has received complaint of the difficulty experienced by persons wishing to be conveyed there."

Considering that the Duke of Connaught lives within a stone's throw of Pall Mall and that every taxicab man's knowledge of London is supposed to be like that of Sam Weller, "peculiar and extensive," the necessity for such pronouncement by the police commissioner might appear to be extraordinary, yet the fact that such instructions have been issued shows that even a London taxi driver sometimes scratches his head dubiously when commanded to drive a fare to Clarence House.

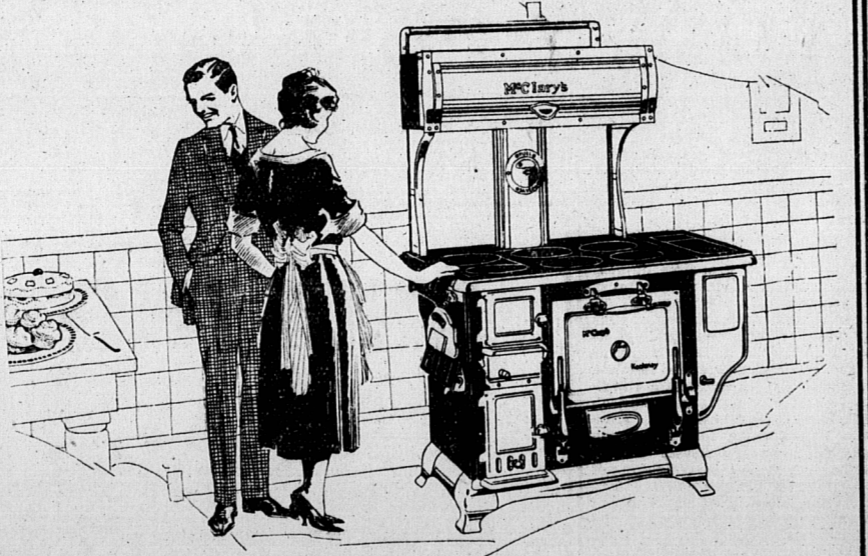
