Tribute To Late Kenneth MacLean

Mr. Kenneth MacLean, born September 6, 1877; died September 17, 1946.

On the evening of September 16th, Mr. MacLean was stricken with a cerebral haemorrhage from which he failed to recover consciousness, and passed quietly to his eternal rest at the early morning of September 17th; mourned by all who were privileged to know him, especially those associated with him in the performance of his duties, as Supervisor of the men's department at Falconwood Hospital.

Mr. MacLean, or "Kennie" as he was known to his intimate friends, was a person of diverse personality attributes: kind but firm, in the performance of his duties, fair and honest in his dealings with those entrusted to his care; honest and upright in all matters. During his years as Supervisor, Mr. MacLean became well known throughout the province to the relatives and the friends of the inmates of the hospital.

During his nineteen years in hospital service, thirteen as Male Supervisor, his chief interest was the welfare of his department. Early in June, owing to ill health, he was forced to relinquish his duties and spent the summer months visiting his relatives; however, feeling much improved in health, he returned to his hospital duties as relief Supervisor.

Lady White Held On Stealing Charge

LONDON, Sept. 23.—(CP)—Lady Elizabeth White, an English beauty who gave up millions to a stage career for marriage, and a 40-year-old tall, moustached friend, were held on charges of stealing a refrigerator and other household goods worth \$20,000 from her mother, the dowager Marchioness of Townshend.

In the trim dining room of the Banling Memorial Hospital where the newspapermen gathered for the interviews, King said he estimated the crash time at about 5:36 a.m. last Wednesday.

That afternoon the survivors got together as a group for the first time and formed a semi-circle around a fire built by the less fortunate.

Continuing with her story, Miss Henderson said: "We sat around giving encouragement to one another. We were all in very fine spirits considering the circumstances. Dewey brought with it, better weather than an anticipated and this seemed to improve our morale but by afternoon we were getting discouraged."
