**St. John's United Church Meeting**

The annual meeting of St. John's United Church, St. Stewart, was held in the auditorium of the church on January 17th. The meeting opened with a brief devotional service, after which the minister spoke of the general work of the church during the past year. He said much had been done, but intimated that the New Year was bringing with new challenges and new opportunities for the church. "The church," he said, "must be wide awake to the importance of her place and influence in stabilizing local social conditions. Nothing can take the place of the church in the community and nation."

Mr. Mercer was asked to act as chairman and Mr. G. W. Jay was elected as secretary. The reports of the different organizations were heard. It was gratifying to note progress in the work and a large increase in finances. The Ladies Aid reported having bought One Hundred Dollar Bond in the Fall Victory Loan Campaign. He concluded by saying: "I am immensely happy if it has pleased God to use me in any way for the benefit of the people."

The meeting closed with the benediction.

**American Nun To Be Canonized**

CHICAGO, Jan. 17 (AP)—A woman who ministered to persons suffering will take her place this month with the saints of the Roman Catholic Church.

She is the late blessed Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini, a slight-fair-complexioned Italian nun who was a United States citizen. While no official confirmation has been received, dispatches from Rome, Switzerland, report that Pope Pius XII will officiate at Canonization Ceremonies in Vatican City some time in January.

Revered by one religious order because she was too small, Mother Cabrini founded her own — the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus — and established a school, a hospital or an orphanage for each of the 67 years of her life. She crossed the Atlantic 23 times, went up and down the Pacific several times, rode burro-back over mountains and criss-crossed the United States.

Besides being the first citizen to be canonized, Mother Cabrini will have the distinction of being sainted only 27 years after her death Dec. 22, 1917, the shortest time ever intervening since Pius IX. Courts have designated those worthy of sanctification.
