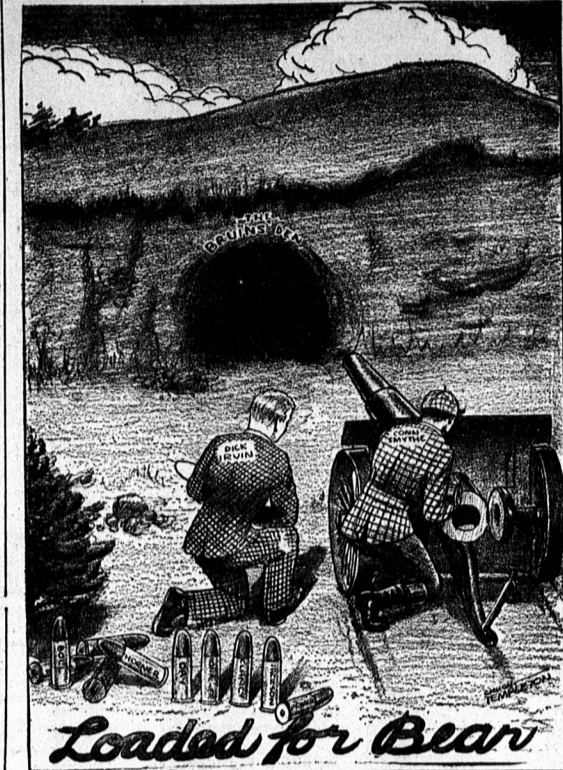

Albert (Nash) MacKinnon, left wing. A very smooth skater, this boy also takes his turn on the defence. He is 15 years old and tips the scales at 136 pounds. Douglas (Raison) Saunders, right wing is one of the most aggressive players on the team. He also is 15 years old and weighs 145 lbs. Bud McEachern, right wing. A fast skater, Bud also packs a very hard shot. He is the biggest boy on the team, 15 years old and weighs 145 lbs. Also plays defence. Arthur (Monk) Perry, centre. One of the youngest members of the team Art is another fast skater and hard shot. Weighs 110 lbs. and is just 14 years old. John (Tarky) Whitlock, centre. Tarky is the smallest player on the squad tipping the scales at 85 lbs. Shoots right and is particularly effective around the net.
