A WARNING TO NEWFOUNDLAND

About Seizing American Vessels While Negotiations Are Pending.

LONDON, Dec. 20.—(Special)—The Foreign Office has instructed the Newfoundland Government to make the strictest enquiry into the complaints made at Washington of the seizure of an American fishing vessel at a Newfoundland port a few days ago.

TORONTO, Dec. 18.—The sinews of war are being raised for the fighting of local option and license reduction, as was stated a couple of days ago. At first a personal call was made upon the license-holders of Toronto for \$100 each, which was to be collected by a man who would drop in. Now an appeal is being sent out broadcast by the Brewers' and Malsters' Association of Ontario to licenseholders, brewers, distillers, malsters and all who are in any way dependent on the traffic, asking for subscriptions.

THE DR. WARDEN ESTATE \$105,776

TORONTO, Dec. 20.—The will of the late Rev. Robert Warden, general agent of the Presbyterian church, has been entered for probate. The estate amounts to \$105,776, of which \$92,128 is in stock and life insurance, and \$1,300 in real estate. Debts of \$30,180 reduced the revenue of the estimate to \$75,688. The estate, except \$3,500 for the Presbyterian church of Canada, is divided among the family.
