THE ONTARIO CONVENTION.

The scheme for partial prohibition which the Toronto News had outlined as the one Premier Ross desired did not materialise before the Liberal convention. Very probably the Premier would be willing to go much further in the direction of prohibition than he could induce his followers to go, and after feeling their pulse he has fallen back on the license system. This cannot fail to antagonise many of the prohibitionists who naturally looked for the Premier to fulfil his promises.

But it must be borne in mind that the position of the Ross government is little less than desperate. It was outvoted badly in the popular vote at the last general election. Its small majority in the Legislature has now wholly disappeared. It is loaded down with a long series of scandals, and the Premier is forced to reconstruct in the face of a general election. The liquor interest in Ontario is powerful. Vast distilleries and breweries and the wealthy and widespread Licensed Victuallers' Association were too influential to be defied by a moribund Administration. So the Premier has surrendered to the liquor interest, taking the desperate chance that its support may pull him through his difficulties.

OUR CHEESE PRODUCTION.

Mr. Heseltine's report published in our issue of yesterday estimates the cheese production of the Island during the past year at no more than 20,000 boxes, as contrasted with a maximum of 65,000 three years ago. This heavy falling-off in one of our staple industries, and one which in the past has been a source of pardonable pride to all, is deeply regrettable. No doubt it was largely due to the dry season and short pastures, but we cannot think this to be the sole cause. The downward tendency has spread over several years and we are led to fear that the factory cheese industry is not in quite so high favor with our farmers as it was some years ago. It may be also that Mr. Heseltine's estimate of this year's production will be found to be under the actual quantity when all the returns are in. At least we hope that such may be the case.
