ORDER OF PRECEDENCE OF OFFICIALS OF CANADA.

With His Royal Highness, the Duke of Connaught, K. G., as Governor General of the Dominion, the official order of precedence, applicable to Canada, may not prove out of place. It stands as follows:—namely— 1. The Governor General, or officer administering the government. 2. Senior officer commanding His Majesty's troops within the Dominion of the rank of a general—and the officer commanding His Majesty's naval forces of the British North American station if of the rank of an admiral. Their own relative rank to be ascertained by the King's regulations on this subject.

- 3. The lieutenant-governor of Ontario. 4. The lieutenant-governor of Nova Scotia. 5. The lieutenant-governor of New Brunswick. 6. The lieutenant-governor of Manitoba. 7. The lieutenant-governor of British Columbia. 8. The lieutenant-governor of Prince Edward Island. 9. The lieutenant-governor of Saskatchewan. 10. The lieutenant-governor of the North West Territories. 11. The commissioner of the Yukon territory. 12. Archbishops and bishops, according to seniority. 13. Members of the cabinet according to seniority. 14. Speaker of the senate. 15. The chief justice of the supreme court of Canada. 16. The chief justice of the courts of law and equity, according to their seniority. 17. Members of the privy council not of the cabinet. 18. The solicitor-general of Canada. 19. General officers of His Majesty's army serving in the Dominion, and officers of the rank of admiral in the royal navy, serving on the British North American station, not being in the chief command, the relative rank of such officers to be determined by the King's regulations. 20. The officer commanding His Majesty's troops in the Dominion, if of the rank of colonel, or inferior rank, and the officer commanding His Majesty's naval force on the British North American station, if of equivalent rank, the relative rank to be ascertained by the King's regulations. 21. Members of the senate. 22. Speaker of the House of Commons. 23. Puisne judges of the supreme court of Canada, according to seniority. 24. Judge of the Exchequer court of Canada. 25. Puisne judges of courts of law and equity, according to seniority. 26. Member of the House of Commons. 27. Speaker of the legislative council (provincial) within their province. 28. Members of the executive council within the province. 29. Speaker of the legislative council within the province. 30. Members of the legislative council within his province. 31. Speaker of the legislative assembly within his province. 32. Members of the legislative assembly within his province. 33. Retired judges of whatever courts to take precedence after the present judges of their respective courts, also were fully described.

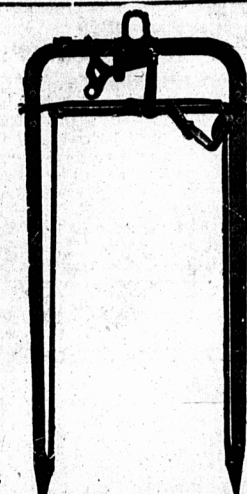

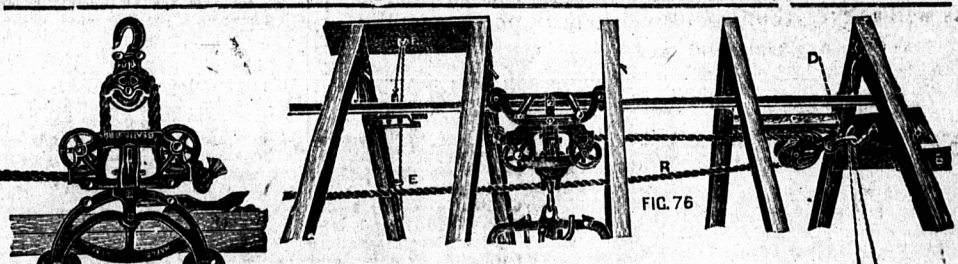
