

Rifle Meet Concluded Yesterday

This Year's Matches Featured By Brilliant Shooting.

The Provincial Rifle Matches were concluded yesterday afternoon at 1:30 in a most sensational manner, by six riflemen shooting off ties in the Ladies Challenge Trophy Match.

The six were Sergeant G. G. McLennan, Captain W. A. Smith, Sergeant P. Landrigan, Private E. Coles, Sergeant J. Poole and Captain A. W. Allan. Each had made 49 points out of a possible 50 in this match in which 36 riflemen represented 36 ladies. Five shots were fired and these resulted in Sergeant Landrigan and Private E. Coles scoring 24 points the others only scoring 23. Conditions required that they each shoot for shot. The greatest excitement prevailed on the Butts as they settled down for the shoot-off, first one would make a bull, then the other, and as darkness was settling down it looked as though night would arrive before the issue would be decided. However, on the fourth shot Sergeant Landrigan's bullet did not quite graze the bull, and the red marker indicating an inner appeared. Would Coles hit the bull? All was expectation and a hush fell on the intensely interested spectators. Coles picked up his rifle very deliberately. A look of quiet determination could be seen in his face as he settled down for what he hoped to be the last and deciding shot. He paused an instant, then pulled, and the white marker indicating that he had hit the bull's eye appeared. A tremendous cheer broke forth and the victor was warmly congratulated. In winning the beautiful trophy for Mrs. Senator Frowse, Private E. Coles of Milton, also became the winner of the John Louson medal awarded for this match. It will be remembered that Thursday Private Coles came into the world's sporting limelight by his magnificent performance in making three consecutive possibles, a feat that has rarely happened at any rifle meet and one that stamps him permanently in the hall of fame. This young man from Milton looks as though he will go far in rifle shooting.

In yesterday morning's Guardian we referred briefly to the Prowse Bros. Match, which was fired at 200, 300 and 600 yards. It was won by Sergeant P. J. Landrigan with the magnificent score of 102 points, which equals the record for this event made by Captain A. W. Allan two years ago. R. L. Coles finished with the same score, but Landrigan had the better score at the long range. Another excellent score in this match was that of Private Eric Coles, who established a century. The Prowse Team Match was won by the P. E. I. Highlanders Team, with a total score of 295 points.

The first match fired yesterday was the Silver Black Fox Match, 10 rounds at 300 yards. This resulted in a win for Naval Cadet A. Gormley, who scored a possible of 50 points, a wonderful shoot. He was closely followed by Captain A. W. Allan and Private A. O. F. Gill, each with 49 points. The scoring in this match was quite high as it was in all others.

The Corporation Match was shot immediately after the Silver Black Fox Match, and resulted in a win for A. L. MacDonald of Summerside with a score of 49 points, out of a possible 50. We may mention that Mr. MacDonald had on account of the difference in ranges, made some errors in his first scores, but when he got on to the hang of things he certainly did some wonderful shooting. All were very pleased indeed to see a western representative win this match and he was heartily congratulated. It is hoped that next year more of the Summerside boys will come down and a greater interest will be taken there in rifle shooting. The faithful band who have been following the game there for years are all very popular chaps whose presence at the Provincial meetings is looked forward to by all.

The Lieutenant-Governor's Match, 10 shots at 600 yards was fired in the afternoon and resulted in a win for Lieut. J. E. Andrew, with a splendid

score of 49 points out of a possible 50. It will be remembered that Lieut. Andrew was the winner of the Grand Aggregate last year. This year he has not been shooting so brilliantly. In this match there were many other good scores made considering the difficult conditions which existed while it was being shot.

The meeting concluded with the Ladies Challenge Trophy Match referred to in the opening paragraph of this report.

The meeting just concluded was one of the most spectacular and most successful from a high class shooting standpoint, ever held here. True, there were not quite so many competitors as last year, but the brilliant shooting made up for their lack.

At the conclusion of the shooting, the President of the Association, Lt.-Colonel H. M. Davison, V.D., presented the Davison Challenge Trophy to Sergeant Percy Landrigan. This trophy is a magnificent one donated by Colonel Davison to the riflemen scoring the greatest number of points in all the matches of the meeting. He also presented Sergeant Landrigan with the Governor General's Silver Medal, the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association Silver Medal and the Louson Medal, these being awarded for various aggregates. Sergeant Landrigan was the outstanding rifleman of the meeting, finishing with a marvelous showing, in that in the entire two days he only lost 18 points, a record that has never been equaled in this province. There is no question that were he to devote himself seriously to rifle shooting he would be one of the Empire's cracks.

The brilliant performance of Private Eric Coles of Milton has been referred to. We must also refer to the wonderful showing of Sergeant J. Poole, of Montague, who, though handicapped by the fact that the rifle range of that village has not been in order, yet finished second to Sergeant Landrigan in the aggregate, thereby winning the Governor General's Bronze Medal and the Dominion of Canada Rifle Association Bronze Medal. Sergeant Poole has the appearance of a typical high class rifle shot. He is cool and collected and holds the rifle with a grip of steel. We hope he will be well equipped for Ottawa and that we may have the pleasure of seeing him and Sergeant Landrigan, our representatives on next year's Bisley.

The Guardian wishes to express its appreciation of the courtesy of the Secretary Lt.-Colonel C. Leigh, V.D., who handled the meeting most capably. To the range officer, Captain J. A. Webster, we are asked to give the thanks of the riflemen for his uniform courtesy and consideration and his genial manner exhibited to all. The statistical department which was headed by Lieut. J. S. Moore, with Captain W. Worth and Mr. A. Francis as assistants, had the results out very quickly indeed. The markers and the targets were splendidly looked after under the capable direction of the range keeper, Sergeant J. King. In conclusion we may say that 1929 will go down in rifle shooting history as a year that will be remembered for a long time.
