The following appeared in the "Story About Town" of the Boston Herald of July 9:— James Jeffrey Roche, the versatile poet and journalist, was educated at St. Dunstan's College, Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island. His alma mater is naturally very proud, and several years ago he was invited to address the graduates at the annual commencement exercises of the institution. Now, there is a sort of unwritten law in "the Garden of the Gulf" against the use of manuscript by orators, except in very rare instances. A man must either express himself extemporaneously or memorize his address and give the impression that it is a spontaneous effort. In spite of this fact, however, the poet appeared upon the platform holding in his hand a neatly folded typewritten manuscript, embodying the address he was about to deliver. The surprise exhibited in the faces of the graduates was not lost upon Mr. Roche. He smiled and, holding up the offending paper, said: "Don't be afraid. I may not have occasion to use it. When I was graduated from old St. Dunstan's I was selected to deliver the valedictory address, and having every confidence in my ability as an extemporaneous orator, I ignored the use of manuscript altogether and contented myself with memorizing in a general way what I had to say. Well I had got as far as the second or third sentence when I was suddenly attacked with that indescribable quaking of the knees and cleaving of the tongue to the roof of the mouth which all of you, perhaps, have at some time experienced. A great lump arose into my throat, cold sweat broke out all over my body and the half-articulated words died away with a grasp on my trembling lips. Ideas vanished like will-o'-the-wisps in a marsh, and the rotund sentences so carefully prepared and got on by rote seemed like some faintly remembered dream. After several ineffectual attempts to proceed I was forced to take my seat—a discouraged, humiliated, but wiser, youth. Since then I have never trusted myself on the sea oratory without a life preserver."
