ECONOMIZING ADMINISTRATION

In conformity with its pre-election promises the Stewart Government is effecting economy in the administration of the government and has decided upon the amalgamation of two important administrative offices, namely, those of the Provincial Engineer and the Superintendent of Education. This will necessitate dispensing with the services of the present Superintendent of Education, Mr. R. H. Rogers, as Mr. H. H. Shaw is fully qualified to discharge the duties of both offices. It is understood that Mr. Rogers' connection with the Department will close at the end of the current month and it is anticipated that he will be appointed Principal of Prince Street School in succession to Principal Seaman who has retired.

Mr. Shaw will not be new to the duties of Superintendent of Education. He had charge of the Department during the most successful period of its history, from 1915 to 1918 when he substituted for Col. R. H. Campbell, who had gone overseas. In addition he holds an enviable record as a teacher and professor, having been Principal of Kensington High School and subsequently Professor in Prince of Wales College. The greater part of the engineering work of the Public Works Department is now nearing its conclusion and with some outside assistance, such as was provided during recent years, Mr. Shaw will be able to efficiently supervise as Consulting Engineer the duties of the office and at the same time be able to carry on the work of the head of the Department of Education.

It will be recalled that the Bell Government, on the eve of the 1919 election made a recommendation along these lines when Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Johnston, moved the abolition of the office of Provincial Engineer. When they got into power they did nothing to give effect to their resolution, but when Col. R. H. Campbell was compelled to resign appointed Mr. R. H. Rogers to fill the vacancy.

EXPERIMENTAL FOX STATION

It is satisfactory to learn that the Minister of Agriculture at Ottawa has agreed to the establishment of an Experimental Fox Station at Charlottetown. It will be remembered that the local legislature passed a vote for \$5,000 to provide and equip such a station on condition that the Dominion Government would establish and administer it. A deputation consisting of Premier Stewart and a number of gentlemen interested in the Fox industry recently waited upon the Dominion Government urging the claim of the Island to have an Experimental Station located here, and yesterday the Premier received intimation that the request had been granted. The Fox Experimental Station will be located on Mt. Edward Road in the vicinity of the Dominion Agricultural Experimental Station to be under the administration of Professor Clark, but with its own animal pathologist, nutrition and breeding expert. The Government and the fox men are to be heartily congratulated upon this achievement which will do much to strengthen and encourage fox ranching and breeding here.

BLOOD PRESSURE AND THE TIME OF DAY

You have been worrying about your blood pressure, because although accepted for insurance, and further assured by your family physician that you were all right, you have learned that your blood pressure was a "little high," or "above the normal," for your age.

Now as I've said before I would be the last one to belittle the importance of blood pressure, but there are so many factors that enter into it, that you may have a high blood pressure at one hour of the day, much above the average in fact, and a blood pressure actually below the average at another hour.

For instance a physician wishing to allay the fears of one of his patients who was worrying over his pressure, adopted a very simple method of accomplishing it. They were neighbors.

Apparently returning for an early professional call one morning, he dropped in on his friend while the latter was still in bed, to borrow a book they had been discussing the evening before.

He sat down beside the bed, and said "Oh by the way, I'll just take that old blood pressure of yours while I'm here."

Chatting carelessly, he adjusted the arm band and secured reading of his blood pressure, which was actually below the average.

The patient was only half convinced so the physician said "Well I'll see you later and we'll try it again."

"All right."

The two played over the full course in the afternoon, and after a shower, were sitting lounging in one of the smaller rooms of the club house.

Again, apparently as a passing thought, the physician produced his instrument and said:

"I might as well try your blood pressure once more." The reading was taken, again showed slightly under the average.

The patient was astonished, but never again worried about his blood pressure.

Now what about this? Well, early in the morning, before your heart gets going strong from food or exercise, the blood pressure is low.

During exercise and after meals it is a little higher than the average.

Toward evening when you are tired, before your evening meal, it is down again.

My point is that your blood pressure is not a fixed thing, but simply shows what is going on in the body.

If you are working hard, are excited, have just eaten, it will go up. If it is high at other than these times, there is a reason which may or may not mean something serious.

Have Yearly Incomes Just Over \$500,000

LONDON, June 2.—There are 542 persons in Great Britain with an average income just over £100,000 a year, according to the income tax return statistics issued here this afternoon. These show 278 persons with incomes between £50,000 and £75,000 a year, 137 between £75,000 and £100,000 and 137 with incomes of more than £100,000.

Descending in the financial scale there are 84,047 persons with incomes from £2,000 to £55,000 a year, making their average more than £5,300 yearly.
