### Rebel Adolescent

#### Good Boarding School May Cure Incurable Girl of 15

DEAR DOROTHY DIX: I have a daughter of 15 who has been having tantrums ever since she was nine years old and who is getting worse all the time. My husband and I have been good and loving parents and she has grown up in a home that, except for her, would have been full of peace and happiness. She has a very high I. Q. rating and has skipped two years of school, but lately her marks are dropping off and she doesn't care, or even take any interest in that.

About every other day we have a scene. I tell her to do something and she argues, screams, and curses me. She doesn't come home from school until 5:30 or 6:30, and if I reprove her for this she yells and carries on like somebody crazy. She keeps the house in an uproar. She scatters her books and clothes on the floor and sometimes doesn't make her bed for weeks at a time, and if I clean up for her she wrecks it the next day.

We have tried all methods to our knowledge of coping with her, but she does not respond to either indulging her and letting her have her own way in every respect, or trying to discipline her. She seems to get her greatest pleasure in making us unhappy. My mother has the same sort of disposition and nobody has ever been able to get along with her.

What do you think I can do to correct this girl's faults?

ANSWER: The Mexicans have a proverb which says: "Strangers' bread makes polite children." And I think the best thing you could do with your obstreperous child is to send her off to some good, strict boarding school where she will be forced to behave herself. Parents have to put up with their children's dispositions, but other people do not, and when your daughter finds out that she has to keep a civil tongue in her head and make herself agreeable, or else be ostracized by all with whom she comes in contact, she will probably turn into a little angel, instead of being a big pest.

Around 15 and 16 there seems to come a crucial time in the good of both parties. This is easily understood, for it is when the children stage their first fight for liberty and when their terrified parents try to put down the rebellion with all the force they can command. Probably there is not a home in which there are adolescent youngsters that isn't a dark and bloody battleground.

Father rages and Mother weeps, but the internecine war goes on, for the children are determined on having dates and boy and girl friends and the parents are equally determined to keep them in leading strings. Add hot syrup a little at a time to egg whites, beating after each addition; add lemon extract. Beat egg yolks until thick and lemon-colored, fold in egg white mixture.
