FAVORITES BEATEN AS RACING MEET CLOSES

Upsets Feature Singles Play In Tournament

McDiarmid Eliminates Laird Watt While Mrs. H. S. Jones Bows To N. B. Lady Ace

Steadiness personified, tall rangy Don McDiarmid of Ottawa, ranked tenth in the Dominion tennis ratings last year, yesterday provided a startling upset in the Eastern Canadian tennis championships...

In a grueling first set that saw eighteen games being played, Watt led at one stage 6-5 as he broke through McDiarmid's service for the first time but the winner evened it up by breaking Watt's service...

Body off his game Watt lost the second set of the match 6-love as McDiarmid's passing shots continually scored points for him. Rallying to break through McDiarmid's service in the ninth game to run 4-0 at 6-4. After a ten minute interval the players returned to the courts but again it was McDiarmid who was the cool, calculating master running up a 3-0 lead before Watt finally won his service to make it 5-1 but the game was only a respite from the inevitable, McDiarmid winning his own service to win the set and match 6-1.

McDiarmid's win was very surprising, but in the women's singles events another startling occurrence happened when Mrs. H. S. Jones of Halifax, defeated her opponent by the last nine years went down to defeat before the smooth-stroking and clever court work of Miss Isabel Matheson of Edmundston, N. B. in two sets by scores of 2-6, 6-2, 7-5.

However, it is easy to criticize the drivers, but one does not know what the driver is sometimes going through with a nervous or sulky horse. It is not fair to write him in some particular manner that he alone knows of, so in justice to all concerned the writer would say that there are faults on both sides but that the driver is usually acting according to what he considered his rights.

The meeting just closed is a notable one in many respects. The time made on the average was fast. There were no serious accidents and the racing was with the keenest possible kind, with more close finishes than many can remember in recent years. It is this spirit to the wire that catches the fancy of the crowd and that in any of the four evenings as long as horse racing can bring out that spontaneity of cheering that it did many times each day, there will be no lack of patrons for the game.

E. A. Grant of Houlton, Maine, was a popular visitor with his two-horse stable, Coburn, 2:16 and Dolly Azoff 2:07 1/2. The Calumet Coburn trotter has not only trotting speed and manners, but beauty as well, and he was particularly noticeable in the 2:16 which he now possesses. As a good performance when he won the 2:17 trot, and he looks headed for a record better than the 2:10 which he now possesses.

John Dean, while being beaten in a great upset race on Tuesday, when Duce Potemkin—very much overlooked—came through to win the third heat in 2:08 1/2, and the fourth in 2:11, both in very close finishes, yet won the prize for the fastest heat trotted during the meet with his performance of 2:09 1/2 in the second heat of the 2:14 Trot. Walter Brown was the fastest pacer with his mile in 2:08 in the first heat of the 2:11 Trot and Pace. These are good performances no matter how you look at it, and shows that the Charlottetown track is one of the best in the Maritimes.

The name of Josie the Great will be inscribed in the Maritime horse racing Hall of Fame for some time to come, by her performance on Wednesday when she set up in the 2:14 Trot, won by Duce Potemkin 2:07 1/2, owned by Wellington McNeill, Southport, and driven by Tyndall Semple. Special Blend was a trotter and a son of the popular Island sire, Black Pilot, owned by Dockendorf Brothers, North River. Black Pilot was sired by All Right, a horse of excellent breeding imported from the United States. Black Pilot's sire was sired by Johnny Conroy, the victor in the memorable Black Pilot-Hernando race at Summerside in 1884, at which an estimated 10,000 people crowded into the track.

The British Consols Trophy, presented by the Macdonald Tobacco Company of Montreal, to the driver scoring the most points at this meet, was given to Johnny Conroy with 14 points. The runner-up was Tyndall Semple with 13 points and Roy Barnett with third with 12 points.

The Peerless and Imperial Fox Feed Trophy, presented by the Manager, John A. MacDonald, for the winner in the Three Year Old Futurity, was won by Willard Kelly with Royal Jim.

Spectators Again Witness Upsets In Two Of Three Classes On Final Card

Hillside Scott, Dolly Azoff And Hal Britton Are The Winners. Large Attendance See Close Finishes With 2:14 Trot And Pace And 2:22 Trot Won In Straight Heats.

The fourth and final day's racing at the Provincial Exhibition yesterday afternoon consisted of the Two Year Old Futurity, the 2:14 Trot and Pace, and the 2:22 Trot. It was a well balanced program from a spectator's standpoint, and resulted in good finishes with fast time recorded in the 2:14 Trot and Pace, the three heats of which averaged better than 2:10.

The Two Year Old Futurity showed that baby trotters can be trained to have good manners and act like veterans, and these youngsters were certainly a credit to the owners and drivers the way they scored, got away and paced throughout the race.

The 2:14 Trot and Pace was of course the big drawing card of the afternoon, and most horsemen believed that the race would be between Viking 2:08 1/2, the Sydney horse, Dolly Azoff 2:07 1/2, from Houlton, Maine, and Signal Senator 2:08 1/2, who was unbeaten this season until yesterday. They were not far astray, with the exception that Duce Potemkin 2:07 1/2, the only trotter in the race, performed so well and put up such fighting finishes that she copped places from Viking and Signal Senator.

The starter had a much easier day, as the discipline was improved. He announced before each event that drivers had been appointed to take the place of those not conforming to his orders.

The Two Year Old Futurity was the first class called, and after several scores they got away. Hillside Scott grabbed the pole with his driver, Johnny Conroy, in the hind. As they turned into the back stretch Hillside Scott made a bad break and lost considerable ground. Polly Scott, taking the lead, drove Conroy straightened out and when half way through the stretch flashed into the lead. Polly Scott beat out Little Audrey for second place.
