## IN MEMORIAM

FRANCIS D. GOODWIN

Many friends in this province will learn with regret of the death of Francis D. Goodwin, of Wellington, P. E. I., which occurred at his home, Toronto, Ont., June 14th at the age of 31 years.

The deceased, who was a son of the late Mr. John M. Goodwin and a nephew of the Hon. Jas. A. McNeill, Commissioner of Public Works, Char-

lottetown, after graduating from the Charlottetown Business College twelve years ago, went to the Western States where he took up the study of Engineering, which occupation he afterwards followed with marked success. Three years ago he settled in Toronto, accepting a position with one of the large Construction Companies of that city.

A few months ago a severe attack of pneumonia followed by pleurisy so weakened his once robust health that he had to resign his position, and he entered one of the large hospitals of Toronto for treatment. In spite of

the best medical skill and loving care his strength gradually faded away. Realizing that his stay on earth was to be brief he desired to visit once more the home of his childhood. This favor was denied him. He was taken suddenly ill, and a telegram summoned his mother to his bedside. A few days later fortified by the last rites of the Church and consoled by his loving mother, he peacefully yielded his spirit up to God.

The deceased was one of the bright young islanders who, if God had given his length of days, would have done honor to his native province. Of a

kind and gentle disposition he made for himself friends amongst all who had the pleasure of his acquaintance. His remains accompanied by his mother arrived at his home in Wellington, Monday, June 17th. On Wednesday his funeral took place to immaculate Conception Church, and was very largely attended, friends and relatives, not only from his own parish, but from the neighboring parishes and Summerside being present to pay their last tribute of respect and esteem. A Requiem Mass was celebrated by the Rev. O. Kiggins, St. Dunstan's College, who assisted by the

Rev. F. L. Connolly, also performed the services at the grave. The pall bearers were: Messrs. B. McNeill, Thos. Noonan, E. Arsenault, J. Condon of Wellington and K. McNeill and D. McDonald, Traveller's Rest.

Besides his bereaved wife he leaves to mourn a sorrowing mother; a sister, Mrs. Charles Ayers, Wellington, and three brothers: Leonard, in the Heavy Artillery, France; and Sydney and Malcolm at home; also a large circle of relatives and friends to whom the Guardian extends sincere sympathy.
