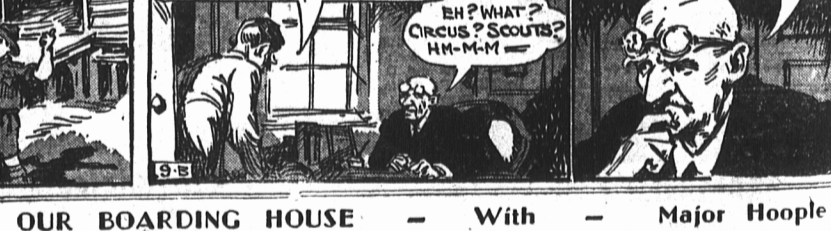
TENNIS LEADER DEAD

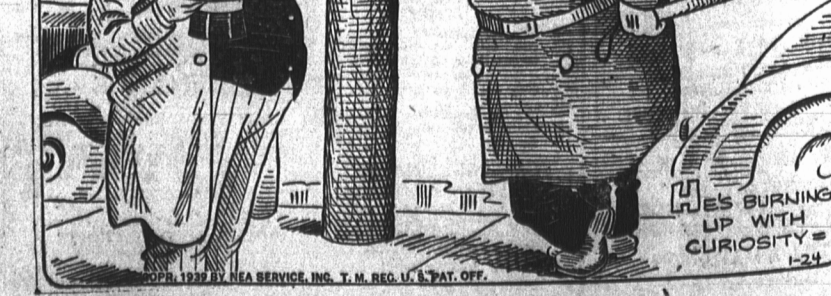
