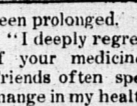

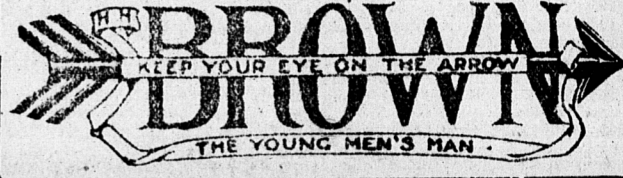

CHARLOTTETOWN DRIVING PARK RACES.

As already announced the dates of the Charlottetown Exhibition this year will be from the 24th to the 27th of September next, both inclusive.

There will be two days' horse racing on Wednesday and Thursday, the 25th and 26th September, offering \$1,800.00 in purses and stakes.

Nominations in the Stakes close Wednesday, 12th June next, when payment of one per cent must be made, second payment of two per cent on the 15th of July and third payment of two per cent on the 15th of August when horses must be named.

The following are the classes and stakes:

First day, Wednesday, Sept. 25th 1912, 2.24 Trot, 2.27 Pace, Purs \$300.00; 2.53 Trot and Pace, Stake \$300.00; 3 Minute Trot, Stake \$250.00.

Second day, Sept. 26th, 1912—2.17 Trot and Pace, Purs \$400.00; 2.35 Trot, Stake, \$300.00; 3 Year Old Trot and Pace, Stake, \$250.00.

The entries in the open classes will close 30th August, 1912.

Horses are barred in the 3 year old Trot and Pace Stake.

TREMENDOUS STRIKE NARROWLY AVERTED.

NEW YORK, April 24—Mediation of the differences between the Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineers and the Eastern Railway which threatened a strike on fifty lines, east of Chicago, and north of the Potomac River is expected to result from the action of the conference committee of railway managers today, agreeing to confer with Chas. P. Neill, United States Labor Commissioner, and Judge Martin J. Knapp of the United States Commerce Court, regarding the dispute. While the answer of the railroads to the letter of Messrs. Neill and Knapp did not definitely accept the mediation, the opinion was expressed by the engineers that in the end this would be the result. Commissioner Neill in an interview, given after he had received the railroad answers, also indicates that he considered that mediation was intended. Tonight in all quarters the opinion is expressed that the possibility of the strike, which yesterday appeared imminent, is remote.
