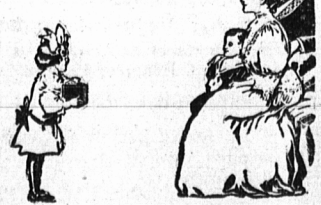
**145th's CHAPLAIN WELL.**—Capt. G. A. Lawson, Chaplain to the 145th Westmorland and Kent Battalion, in the courteous and brief letter to a member of the Moncton Daily Times' staff, says: "We are having great weather these days. I am enjoying everything, and never had better health. This will be good news for Chaplain Lawson's many friends throughout the Maritime Provinces and elsewhere.

**RECRUITING IN AUGUST.**—About seven battalions were recruited in the Dominion during the month of August. The exact number was 7,247. Of this number, military district No. 6, which is made up of New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island, contributed 732 men. The results from the remaining districts are as follows: Military district No. 1, 572 men; No. 2, 985; No. 3, 991; No. 4, 956; No. 5, 295; No. 10, 993; No. 11, 1,155, and No. 13, 628 men.

**WEDDING BELLS.**—The marriage took place Tuesday morning Sept. 12th at St. John church, New Glasgow, by the Rev. Father McLeod, of that parish, of Mr. Paul Doyle, of French Village, P.E.I., and Miss Frances McKinnon, of Charlottetown, P.E.I. After the marriage ceremony the bridal party rode by automobile to the home of Mr. and Mrs. H. A. Ward on James street, where a grand wedding feast awaited them. After the wedding feast was over the bridal party spent the afternoon in an auto trip through New Glasgow and Stellarton. The contracting parties intend to reside in New Glasgow.
